Minyak masak: Serap anggota penguatkuasa KPDN bawah AKPS

PETALING JAYA: Kakitangan Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) perlu diletakkan di bawah Agensi Kawalan dan Perlindungan Sempadan (AKPS) dengan ditugaskan secara bersama dalam mengekang masalah penyeludupan minyak masak bersubsidi ke negara jiran.

Presiden Persatuan Pengguna Subang dan Shah Alam (CASSA), Datuk Seri Dr. Jacob George, berkata, ia bagi memastikan keberkesanan operasi membanteras penyeludupan dapat dilaksanakan di kawasan pintu sempadan.

Pelaksanaan itu sekaligus memperluaskan skop dan kawasan operasi yang tidak hanya terhad kepada penyeludup semata-mata sebaliknya mereka yang turut bersekongkol dengan aktiviti berkenaan.

“Sebahagian anggota penguatkuasa boleh memberi fokus kepada peniaga atau pembekal yang bersubahat menjual minyak masak bersubsidi kepada penyeludup.

“Sebahagian lagi mungkin boleh melaksanakan tugas risikan dan operasi bersama dengan agensi lain di kawasan *hotspot* di kawasan sekitar pintu sempadan negara,” katanya kepada *Utusan Malaysia* semalam.

Media sebelum ini melaporkan, minyak masak subsidi dari Malaysia, dijual secara terbuka di negara jiran.

Dalam perkembangan berkaitan, Jacob mempersoalkan keberkesanan sistem elektronik Skim Penstabilan Harga Minyak Masak (eCOSS) yang digunakan kerajaan bagi menjejak aliran minyak masak subsidi dari pembungkus hingga ke peruncit.

Katanya, walaupun sistem itu dilaksanakan sejak awal tahun ini, kes penyeludupan masih berlaku.

Bung calls for transparency on use of LPG cylinders

KOTA KINABALU: Sabah Umno Chief Datuk Seri Bung Moktar Radin urged the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) to demonstrate greater transparency in the enforcement of its Ops Gasak operation, particularly concerning the mandatory use of commercial liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) cylinders by food premises.

"This is crucial to ensure that any weaknesses or confusion are not hidden but instead addressed openly and responsibly," he said in a statement.

Bung claimed that small food business operators in Sabah are now anxious and uncertain about the enforcement move, attributing the concern to a lack of clear and comprehensive information regarding the operation.

"The people of Sabah, especially small traders in the food sector, are uneasy with KPDN's directive requiring the use of commercial LPG cylinders.

"The confusion stems from the lack of detailed explanation, which has led to misunderstandings and anxiety among small food operators," he said.

He urged KPDN to adopt a more inclu-

sive and trader-friendly approach, while also calling on the State Government to be proactive in explaining the matter to the public.

"It is the State Government's responsibility to provide complete information and assist small traders in applying for the Scheduled Controlled Goods Permit (PBKB).

"Such efforts will not only strengthen compliance with regulations but also protect the survival of small businesses, which are the backbone of the local economy," he said.

He added that if the government deems the use of domestic cooking gas unsuitable for certain food premises, then guidelines and implementation conditions must be clearly and transparently communicated.

"There must be a balance between enforcement and consideration of on-the-ground realities. That balance is the foundation of administrative efficiency and public well-being.

"I call on all relevant parties to demonstrate stronger commitment to addressing this issue comprehensively, fairly, and prudently," Bung said.

Bung Moktar urges transparency in 'Ops Gasak' enforcement to protect small traders

KOTA KINABALU: Umno Sabah chief Datuk Seri Bung Moktar Radin has urged the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) to be more transparent in enforcing its 'Ops Gasak' initiative, amid rising concern among small food business operators in the state.

In a statement on Monday, Bung Moktar said the lack of clear information surrounding the operation has caused confusion and anxiety among small traders, especially over the mandatory use of commercial liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) cylinders in food premises.

"Transparency is vital to ensure that any weaknesses or misunderstandings are addressed openly and responsibly, rather than being swept under the rug," he said.

He noted that many food vendors in Sabah are now uncertain about how the new enforcement measures will affect their operations, attributing the confusion to inadequate communication and unclear guidelines from the ministry.

The people, especially those in the food sector, deserve comprehensive information and support. Without it, small traders are left in the dark – worried and unsure about

how to comply with the new requirements," he added.

Bung Moktar urged KPDN to adopt a more inclusive and trader-friendly approach to enforcement, and called on the Sabah state government to play a more proactive role in clarifying the matter to the public.

"The government must provide complete information and assist traders in applying for the Scheduled Controlled Goods Permit (PBKB)," he said, warning that failure to do so could jeopardize the survival of small businesses, many of which are vital to the local economy.

He further stated that if domestic cooking gas is indeed unsuitable for use in food premises, the ministry must clearly outline the guidelines and enforcement procedures to avoid perceptions of unfairness.

"There needs to be a balance between regulatory enforcement and real-world conditions on the ground. That is the foundation of good governance and public welfare," Bung Moktar said.

He urged all parties involved to show greater commitment to resolving the issue in a comprehensive, fair and empathetic manner.
