Lorry owner fined for unlicensed diesel

IPOH: A man was fined RM100,000 by the Kuala Kangsar Sessions Court for the possession of unlicensed controlled goods.

Ong Seow Hooi, 49, who owns a tanker lorry, was charged under the Control of Supplies Act 1961.

The state Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry said he was accused of committing the offence in Jalan Puncak Bougainvillea, Kuala Kangsar, at 2.45am on Jan 6 last year.

“The accused was arrested along with a modified lorry containing 4,432 litres of diesel stored in an intermediate bulk container, which raised reasonable suspicion that he was trading scheduled goods, in this case, diesel, through wholesale or retail transactions without a valid licence.

“The accused pleaded guilty after the charge was read before judge Rohaida Ishak,” said the statement yesterday, Bernama reported.

Ong paid the fine.

非法擁柴油 男子罰10萬

(江沙16日讯) 华裔男子被控非法持有受管制的柴油, 今日在江沙地庭认罪, 他被判罚款10万令吉, 若无法缴还罚款, 将面对12个月的监禁。

霹靂州国内贸易及生活成本局主任拿督卡马鲁丁今日发文告说, 当局不会对任何非法处理受管制物品的行为妥协, 并会采取更严厉的对付行动, 包括提控上庭。

此案被告黄绍辉(49岁, 译音)是油罐车的车主, 他于去年1月6日凌晨2时45分, 在霹靂州江沙宝巾花山顶路, 被该局江沙分局执法人员逮捕, 当时他正驾驶一辆改装罗厘, 车上载有4432公升柴油, 储存在IBC油槽内。

当局相信, 被告涉嫌在未获合法执照下, 从事批发或零售柴油的非法交易活动, 违反1961年供应控制法令。

案件于今日在江沙地庭开审, 被告在聆听控状后认罪。

主控官为国内贸易及生活成本部官员莫哈末尼占, 黄氏则有律师代表出庭。

法官最终判处他罚款10万令吉, 否则将面对12个月监禁, 被告当庭缴清罚款。

Pelaksanaan subsidi bersasar RON95 akan diteruskan

Kuala Lumpur: Rancangan pelaksanaan subsidi bersasar RON95 akan diteruskan seperti yang dirancang, kata Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim.

Perdana Menteri semalam meneguhkan jaminan bahawa pelaksanaan subsidi bersasar RON95 tidak akan menjejaskan sebahagian besar rakyat.

Menurutnya, terdapat banyak kempen negatif mengenai RON95 dan menjelaskan apa yang dikatakan oleh pembangkang hanyalah gimik yang menunjukkan bahawa rakyat sedang mengalami kesusahan.

"Sama ada kita akan melaksanakan (subsidi bersasar RON95)? Ya... kita akan melakukannya, kerana rasionalisasi subsidi adalah sesuatu yang kritikal untuk negara kita.

"Kita mahu mempunyai sumber yang mencukupi untuk membantu golongan miskin, untuk meningkatkan kualiti pendidikan, memberikan perkhidmatan awam yang lebih baik termasuk kesihatan," katanya ketika ditemui di Energy Asia 2025 di sini, semalam.

Beliau berkata demikian bagi mengulas sama ada kerajaan akan terus melaksanakan subsidi bersasar RON95 atau sebaliknya.

Pada pembentangan Belanjawan 2025 pada Oktober tahun lalu, Perdana Menteri yang juga Menteri Kewangan mengumumkan bahawa kerajaan merancang melaksanakan penyesaran subsidi petrol RON95 pada pertengahan tahun ini.

Baru-baru ini, Menteri Ke-



wangan II, Datuk Seri Amir Hamzah Azizan dilaporkan berkata bahawa kerajaan akan tetap melaksanakan rasionalisasi subsidi RON95 seperti yang dirancang pada separuh kedua tahun ini.

Beliau berkata, perbincangan berkaitan rasionalisasi subsidi masih berjalan di peringkat Jawatan Menteri bagi meneliti mekanisme terbaik untuk pelaksanaan menyeluruh dan adil kepada rakyat.

Subsidi bersasar RON95 perlu diteruskan

Masa tepat untuk dilaksanakan berikutan konflik di Asia Barat

Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim menegaskan bahawa rasionalisasi subsidi RON95 tetap diteruskan namun tidak akan menjejaskan sebahagian besar rakyat.

Beliau berkata, berikutan peningkatan harga minyak ketara susulan konflik Israel-Iran di rantau Asia Barat, timbul cadangan sekarang masa tepat untuk melaksanakan subsidi bersasar.

Bagaimanapun, katanya, banyak kempen negatif berhubung RON95 yang ditaburkan pihak tertentu, sedangkan kerajaan sudah berulang kali memaklumkan bahawa tiada isu tentang peningkatan harga RON95 yang boleh mempengaruhi subsidi.

"Perkara itu harus sentiasa diingat, apa yang diuar-uarkan blok pembangkang adalah satu gimik terdesak untuk menunjukkan rakyat menghadapi kesusahan.

"Banyak sangat khabar negatif daripada mereka (pembangkang), ketika ini kita perlukan khabar positif untuk membantu membangkitkan ekonomi," ujarnya ketika ditemui pemberita selepas menghadiri Persidangan Energy Asia 2025 di Pusat Konvensyen Kuala Lumpur, (KLCC) di sini pada Isnin.

untuk meningkatkan mutu perkhidmatan awam seperti pendidikan, kesihatan dan bantuan kepada golongan rentan.

"Kita ingin mempunyai sumber mencukupi untuk membantu orang miskin, meningkatkan kualiti pendidikan dan memberikan perkhidmatan kesihatan yang lebih baik," katanya.

Sementara itu, Perdana Menteri berkata, kedudukan dan operasi Petronas kekal stabil biarpun dalam suasana geopolitik dan pasaran global yang tidak menentu.

Menurut beliau, keyakinan pelabur utama seperti TotalEnergies, Electrical Instrumentation Engineering (E&I) dan Aramco terhadap Petronas menjadi bukti kekuatan dan reputasi syarikat minyak nasional itu di peringkat antarabangsa.

Anwar juga berkata, Malaysia berada di landasan kukuh untuk muncul sebagai hab tenaga utama rantau Asia Tenggara menjelang

akhir tahun ini, hasil dasar ekonomi yang konsisten serta kestabilan politik semasa.

"Alhamdulillah, keadaan ini menunjukkan keyakinan dan kepercayaan kita untuk cepat meningkat sebagai satu hab tenaga dalam tahun ini," katanya.

Mengulas lanjut, beliau berkata, beberapa syarikat tenaga utama dunia termasuk E&I dari Itali dan Aramco dari Arab Saudi akan menandatangani perjanjian penting dengan Malaysia dalam masa terdekat.

"Keyakinan pelabur besar seperti E&I dan Aramco itu menunjukkan kepercayaan mereka kepada kepercayaan Petronas dan kestabilan pelaburan di Malaysia," katanya.

Beliau menyifatkan perkembangan ini sebagai isyarat positif kepada pasaran global bahawa Malaysia terus menjadi destinasi pelaburan yang diyakini, terutamanya dalam sektor tenaga.

Life on the edge of grocery bill

LET us get one thing straight – being Malaysian these days feels like being stuck in a game of *Survivor: Inflation Edition*.

You wake up, stretch, brush your teeth, check your phone and bam! Another notification that something else is going to cost more.

First it was eggs. Then American goods. Now, insurance premiums are climbing too. What's next? Even this *makcik* is cringing in dread!

Ah, the humble egg. Or, as every Malaysian mother affectionately calls it, "*makanan penyelamat hujung bulan*" – the ultimate last-ditch effort to keep starvation at bay when your wallet's drier than a kampung road in a heatwave.

This trusty little oval, once the undisputed champion of emergency meals, is now flirting with luxury status. At this rate, we'll need a bank statement just to crack one open – maybe even a credit check!

Whether it is the removal of subsidies, rising chicken feed prices or supply chain issues, some blame global warming or that one aunty who hoards 12 trays "just in case."

Regardless, Malaysians have always had a deep emotional relationship with eggs.

Half-boiled with toast in *kopitiams*. Masak lemak with *petai* in *kampungs*. Or wrapped in *nasi lemak* at your local roadside stall, only to discover that there is no egg inside, just *sambal* and heartbreak.

Now imagine the horror when egg prices go up. *Makcik* near the *pasar*

said, "*Kalau macam ni, baik saya bela ayam kat rumah je!*" (If this is the case, might as well I rear chicken at home). And we all laughed. Until we realised ... she wasn't joking.

Moving on to American goods. From overpriced jeans to iPhones and protein powders that promise Hulk-like biceps but deliver credit card trauma instead.

These days, looking at a US\$ price tag is enough to make even the *makcik* with five condos and a personal driver go, "*Eh, mahal jugak ni!*" (Eh, this is quite pricey).

Want to buy a tub of peanut butter? That'll be RM35. Want imported cereal that tastes like cardboard and regret? RM45.

And let's not talk about gadgets. One fella tried to buy the latest iPhone but ended up applying for a personal loan, selling one kidney and pawning his childhood memories.

Of course, Malaysians are resilient. We're the same people who can make 47 TikToks complaining about prices, then still queue two hours at a US burger franchise opening because "*Wah, once in a lifetime!*" Priorities, *kan?*

But wait, we haven't even reached the final boss yet: insurance premiums. Yes, the thing you grudgingly pay for and hope you never have to use. Well, congratulations! It's more expensive now.

Motor insurance? Up. Medical coverage? Up. Life insurance? Also up, although, ironically, your actual life expectancy might be going down

due to all this stress.

Insurance agents everywhere are now rebranding themselves as financial therapists.

They don't just sell plans; they listen to your sob story, nod sympathetically and then explain why your monthly premium now costs more than your car instalment.

"Bang, kalau nak coverage lengkap, you kena tambah sikit je, RM400 extra per month," they say with a straight face, while you mentally calculate how many Maggi packets you'll need to survive next month.

And it's not just the working crowd feeling the pinch. Retirees, yes, our beloved aunts and uncles, are also getting whacked.

Many of them, with no active income, now find themselves having to fork out more for the same health coverage.

For elderly Malaysians living on EPF crumbs or children's allowances, rising premiums are more than just annoying; they're terrifying. Some are being forced to reduce coverage or drop policies altogether.

So the next time you see an old uncle at the pharmacy measuring out his pills with a calculator, give him a nod. He's doing financial acrobatics we can't even comprehend.

And it's not just individuals. SMEs are also taking hits from every angle. Import costs? Up. Raw materials? Up. Office toilet paper? Don't even ask.

One HR executive joked that her company had to downgrade staff medical insurance from the "gold

plan" to some thing more like the "recycled can plan."

Another joked that if an employee fainted now, their SOP was to just fan them with a company memo and hope for the best.

The bigger picture here? This cocktail of rising costs is brewing a deeper worry: How long can the average Malaysian hold on before something snaps?

The cost of living has always been a slippery slope, but now it's become a full-on jungle obstacle course.

And we're not all trained like those ninja warriors from TV. Most of us just want to survive, afford some *telur*, maybe buy a proper toothpaste brand instead of generic toothpaste "*cap Gigi-Gigi Gembira*", and have a little left over for an indulgence like Roti John with cheese.

Unless this is resolved, it's back to the grind – scrolling online platforms for the cheapest *telur* deal and skipping luxury baristas to buy *kopi kampung*.

Malaysians are nothing if not resourceful. We'll budget, bargain, barter, and bawl – but somehow, we'll still make it to payday with just enough left for *teh o ais limau*. Because we don't really have a choice.

And honestly, where else can you be broke and emotionally drained, yet still find the energy to go full keyboard warrior over the little things? Priorities, *kan!*

依赖油气税收 补贴负担沉重

经济结构改革刻不容缓

(吉隆坡 16 日讯) 大马经济正面临“内忧外患”，国内各项改革阻力重重，国外则美国关税与地缘政治局势紧张而“乌云密布”，急需尽速对症下药，才能安渡险滩。

在最新的以色列与伊朗冲突，加剧原已紧张的全球地缘政治局势的背景下，专家学者呼吁政府尽快拟定一套全面、协调的经济应急方案，以强化国家在财政、货币与供应链方面的安全保障。

然而，大马却面对两项主要的经济结构性挑战，一是财政过度依赖石油与天然气税收，一旦国际能源价格下滑，政府收入将大幅缩水；二是长期维持高额的燃油与电力补贴，已对财政构成沉重负担。

经济学者认为，我国的国债已逼近国内生产总值(GDP)65%上限，财政应对危机的空间有限，而当前政治震荡与决策迟缓，削弱外资信心，加剧市场观望情绪，因此政府须尽快稳定政局，明确关键政策如汽油补贴与销售及服务税(SST)调整的时间表，并在国际油价变动的敏感期避免政策冲击叠加，以减缓通胀压力。

税务专家强调，补贴制度必须逐步改革，将资源精准分配给真正需要的群体，并避免采取“一刀切”的做法。
