High concerns over low availability ahead of Aidilfitri

JOHOR BARU: Consumers here are feeling the strain of a cooking oil shortage, with many hoping the matter can be addressed before Hari Raya Aidilfitri.

Taman Molek resident Siti Nur Agilla Omar, 37, said it is difficult to find the hottles of cooking oil

to find 1kg bottles of cooking oil and subsidised cooking oil packets, which are palm oil, in her housing area.

housing area.
"I usually get my supplies from a wholesale market in the Pandan area nearby.
"There, we are limited to two packets of the subsidised cooking oil per person," she said, adding that these could last her family two weeks. two weeks.

The mother of three added that she was told by the shop owners that the number of cooking oil packets sold were limited due to low supply. "This problem should be tack-

led soon as Hari Raya is coming up and cooking oil is a staple ingredient in preparing festive dishes for our loved ones.

"If the smaller bottles or cooking oil is a staple in the smaller bottles or cooking oil is a staple of the smaller bottles."

ing oil packets are still unavaila-ble, I will have to buy the 5kg bottles, which are much more expensive and add to our already rising cost of living," said Siti Nur

Aqilla. Skudai resident G. Gaya, 35, prefers to buy the 1kg cooking oil bottles as she does not cook often. "My husband and I have differ-

ent work schedules, so I only cook once or twice a week.

"The 1kg bottles are perfect for us as we prefer buying groceries

is as we preter haying groteries in low quantities.

"Since it is difficult to get the 1kg bottles these days, I have switched to a 3kg bottle, which is taking us a long time to finish. The

taking us a long time to finish. The cost is three times higher, too," said the administrative assistant. Insurance agent Tan Soon Guan, 33, said the supply of cook-ing oil in Gelang Patah where he lives was sufficient but subsidised cooking oil packets were hard to find

"I recently went to a wholesale chain and a hypermarket chain in Iskandar Puteri but could not find packet cooking oil.

"I am in charge of cooking for my family and usually buy the

5kg cooking oil, which is priced at RM30 as those are the easiest to

find," he said.

Malaysia Consumer Justice
Association president R. Permal Ramasamy said there should not have been a shortage of cooking oil as Malaysia is one of the larg-est producers of palm oil. He also called for stricter regu-

he also called for stricter regulation and enforcement against businesses hoarding subsidised cooking oil, highlighting instances where some restaurants stock-

piled large quantities.

Permal also encouraged high-income groups to refrain from buying the subsidised cooking oil and allow low-income households to benefit from it.

Johor Domestic Trade and Cost

of Living Ministry (KPDN) director Lilis Saslinda Pornomo told *The Star* there was a minor supply disruption in Mersing following the Chinese New Year, but it was resolved after discussions with wholesalers.

"So far, there have been no major disruptions," she said.
Lilis added that KPDN was also working on reorganising cooking

working on reorganising cooking oil distribution and would engage with repackaging companies, refineries and wholesalers to ensure smooth supply in the com-

ing months.

Shops running out of local oil

Empty shelves in Johor stores as 1kg, 2kg bottles run out

JOHOR BARU: It has been difficult for consumers to find 1kg and 2kg bottles of local cooking oil in various parts of Johor.

Checks by *The Star* at sundry shops and supermarkets in Larkin, Tampoi, Pasir Gudang and Kulai found empty shelves as retailers say the cooking oil has been out of stock since the beginning of the year.

Wong Kok Wai, who owns a second generation wholesale and sundry shop here, said his stock has been low since January as suppliers stopped supplying the 1kg and 2kg bottles of the edible palm oil

"A 1kg bottle of palm oil retails at around RM6.90 while a 2kg bottle is priced at RM12.70.

"At the moment, we have other options like peanut oil, canola oil, corn oil and sunflower oil, which cost almost double compared to palm oil.

"Our supply of the RM2.50 subsidised cooking oil packets is still steady," he said when interviewed.

Wong, who is also Johor Federation of Grocery and Sundry Goods Merchants Association secretary, added that the shortage of the bottled cooking oil was a nationwide problem, probably due to the "all-time high" crude palm oil prices.

"The global market price for crude palm oil is expected to go up RM5,300 per tonne. Previously, the highest price was RM3,800 per tonne."

"Factories are reluctant to increase production because selling at government-controlled prices is not profitable for them.

"The 5kg bottled oil is still available at RM30.90, but supply is limited," he said, advising consumers to buy only what they need.

Checks at several hypermarket and supermarket chains found a shortage of 1kg and 2kg bottles of palm oil, while 3kg and 5kg bottles were available.

General manager of a supermarket chain, Mas Imran Adam, said the cooking oil supply problem began in December. "In January, we received only 25% of our usual supply. If we normally get 1,000 tonnes, this time we received only 250 tonnes," he said.

"Many of our branches are affected. Some outlets may have only one type of cooking oil in stock, while others have none at all. The 1kg and 2kg cooking oils are particularly scarce," he said.

Another supermarket owner Tiong Foo Kai said there was an unexpected increase in demand for cooking oil of late.

"Normally, our supply of 250kg of packet cooking oil can last a week, but now a week's supply will be snapped up within an bour

"Even with a purchase limit of three packets per person, customers are coming in groups to buy in bulk.

"We receive at least 2,000kg of cooking oil per month so the supply is there, but we do not understand why people are panic buying," he said.

When contacted, Johor investment, trade, consumer affairs and human resources committee chairman Lee Ting Han said the state government is aware of the issue and is looking into it.

issue and is looking into it.

He said Johor Mentri Besar
Datuk Onn Hafiz Ghazi has been
alerted on the matter.

"We will call up the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry to look for solutions, for example channelling supply to more populated areas or adjusting the current supply and quota system."

'Step up monitoring, enforcement to rectify dwindling supply'

PETALING JAYA: Following reports about cooking oil shortage in Johor, retailers and consumer groups are urging the Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Ministry (KPDN) to take action to prevent discriming for action to prevent disruptions for Malaysian consumers. Datuk Ameer Ali Mydin, man-

aging director of Mydin Hyper-market, said the shortage is being observed nationwide.
"We became aware of the short-

age early last month," he said, adding that Mydin was not the

only retailer forced to place limits on their cooking oil sales. Ameer, who is also president of

the Bumiputra Retailers Organi-sation, said consumers were hor-rified by the sight of empty shelves last weekend.

He shared concerns about how the lack of supply was impacting consumers during the peak sea-son of Ramadan and how it might, if left unresolved, affect the upcoming Hari Raya Aidilfitri celebrations.

"The government needs to be more proactive," he added, emphasising the need for the relevant authorities to provide information on any action being taken

to address the shortage.

He also expressed frustrations about the prioritisation of cooking oil exports over supply in the

domestic market.

"We are the second largest country in the world for exporting cooking oil, but we can't find it in our own country?" Federation of Malaysian Consu-

mers Associations (Fomca) chief executive Saravanan Thambi-rajah, however, said Fomca has not yet received any consumer complaints about a shortage, but stressed the importance of resolving the matter soon.

"Ensuring a stable supply of essential commodities like cook-ing oil is vital for consumer welfare and market stability.
"Delays in resolving such short-

ages can lead to increased prices and burden consumers, especially

those from lower income groups."
Like Mydin, Thambirajah
believes the solution to the shortage lies in clearly-communicated,
meaningful efforts from KPDN.

"Fomca urges the ministry to implement effective monitoring and enforcement measures to ensure subsidised cooking oil

reaches its intended recipients."
As at press time, KPDN had not

commented on the matter.

Meanwhile, in Labuan, KPDN director Junaidah Arbain assured the public that the supply of essential items such as sugar, polybag cooking oil, and flour remained sufficient despite increased demand during Ramadan.

Junaidah, however, acknowledged concerns raised by Ramadan bazaar traders over the lack of cooking oil supply in recent weeks, but clarified that wholesalers who have not received their stock of polybag cooking oil would receive their supply by the second week of March.

近百摊位多数合规

(山打根五日讯)山打根贸易部 在斋戒月开跑后,今天第一次出动 进行市场检查。

行动由阿芝迪朱基里总监(Azdy Zukkry John)带领下,在山打根北路六里万达 Bataras 霸级市场停车场的斋月集市进行了监视和检查、目的是为了确保商家遵守贸消强制执行的法律,并且商家不为牟取暴利的作业。

将重点监控商品供应和价格、廉价销售、称重设备的使用、假冒或盗版商品的销售以及开斋节必需品的销售。

今天下午对斋月集市约 100 个摊位进行的检查发现,几乎所有商贩都遵守了贸易和工业部执行的法

律,特别是在 2011 年《价格管制和反 暴利法》 (AKHAP) 下的价格标记方 面。

贸消部每逢斋月集市进行重点检 查整个地区的公共市场、超市、冷藏 货市场和零售商店等商业场所也在范 围内。

阿芝迪朱基里呼吁商户需严格遵 守政府制定的法律,以诚信的方式经 营,切勿牟取暴利。

根据 2011 年《正义与发展法案》,如果任何人被判犯有过度获利罪,他/她可能被处以不超过 100,000 令吉的罚款或不超过三年的监禁,或两者并处。任何根据本法被判有罪的公司团体可进一步被处以不超过500,000.00 令吉的罚款。

个人若未能在所售商品上贴上价格标签或价目表而被定罪,将被法庭处以最高 50,000 令吉的罚款或两年监禁,或两者并处,或可被处以最高 25,000 令吉的罚金。同时,犯下此类罪行的公司可被处以最高 100,000 令吉的罚款或最高 50,000 令吉的罚金。

自 2025 年 1 月 1 日至今,内政部 山打根分部已进行了 1683 次检查,其 中在城市进行了 1124 次检查,在山打 根县的乡村地区进行了 559 次检查。

Consumers urged to adopt smart spending habits

Budgeting price comparison and mindful purchasing can help curb overspending: Experts

PETALING JAYA: The public are advised to adopt smarter spending habits to avoid impulsive purchases and overspending during the fasting month at Ramadan bazaars.

With about 40 bazaars in Kuala Lumpur alone - drawing large crowds eager to explore diverse food offerings - the abundance of choices can lead to unplanned spending.

Universiti Teknologi Mara department of economics and financial studies senior lecturer Dr Mohamad Idham Md Razak said such behaviour can be controlled by using pre-commitment techniques such as cash-only budgets and organised shopping lists to curb unnecessary expenses. "Implementing fixed income percentage

implementing fixed income percentage spending limits and practicing delayed gratification by returning to stalls after an initial viewing helps prevent overspending. "It aligns with the 'nudge theory,' which subtly guides consumer behaviour while preserving individual choice, ensuring smarter financial decisions during festive shopping," he said.

A check by the Sun at several hazars in the

A check by theSun at several bazaars in the Klang Valley revealed noticeable price increases for various food items compared

For example, a serving of chicken briyani, previously priced at RM10, now costs RM15, while Roti John, a popular Ramadan favourite which used to be RM8 to RM10, is now RM12.

Many food hawkers highlighted factors such as rising costs of raw materials and rental fees for their stalls as reasons for the price hike, resulting in consumers spending more

for the same meals, Mohamad Idham said comparing prices helps consumers make cost-effective choices, reducing personal expenses while pressuring vendors to maintain competitive pricing, ultimately improving market transparency.

"Spontaneous buying at bazaars redirects money away from necessary expenses, while causing short-term spending to increase at the cost of he said. financial

He added that the high demand for certain

foods during Ramadan puts pressure on supply chains, causing temporary price

"Prices usually stabilise after the festive season, but ongoing supply issues or hoarding can keep costs high, creating price instability similar to what is seen in unpredictable markets," he said.

The price dynamics at bazaars are influenced by seasonal factors as sellers take advantage of the once-a-year demand for traditional goods to increase prices, knowing consumers are less sensitive to price changes during this period.

"During Ramadan, price spikes for certain ingredients and products become more

pronounced due to seasonal scarcity.

"Price comparison and budget tracking apps, such as MAE by Maybank, help reduce information gaps, allowing users to make quick and informed decisions," he said.

Federation of Malaysian Consumers Associations chief operating officer Nur Asylkin Aminuddin said while complaints about overpriced items at bazaars remain low as the fasting month has just begun, consumers have already

"We have received feedback regarding food

items not aligning with advertised prices. This, along with complaints about high prices and poor quality, creates an unfair situation for consumers and could lead dissatisfaction," she said.

Nur Asyikin urged vendors to practice ethical pricing and maintain food quality to ensure a fair and enjoyable experience for all consumers.

She also called on sellers to display prices clearly in a way that is easily visible to consumers, ensuring transaction transparency and allowing consumers to make informed decisions before purchasing.

*Consumers should be mindful of their budget when making purchases. If the price of food does not match its quality, a complaint can be filed with the Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Ministry. "Consumers are also encouraged to be

more disciplined by purchasing only what they need to reduce food and money wastage," she said.

She added that adopting mindful spending habits helps maintain personal finances and reduces environmental impact, as food wastage is an increasingly

Jangan biar beras jadi seperti minyak masak peket

SEJAK 1 Mac lalu dikatakan sebanyak 24 juta kampit beras putih tempatan bersubsidi bagi pek 10 kilogram yang dijual pada harga RM26 berada dalam pasaran.

Dimaklumkan oleh pihak Kawal Selia Padi dan Beras, kesemua kampit itu adalah untuk 400,000 keluarga miskin dengan had dua pek bagi setiap keluarga tersebut.

Selepas hampir seminggu, apa yang berlaku? Hasil tinjauan wartawan akhbar ini di beberapa buah negeri, bekalan beras putih tempatan tersebut masih belum ada di pasaran sama ada di pasar taya mahupun di kedai run-

Bagi negeri-negeri yang sudah mula menerimanya pula, hanya dalam jumlah yang terhad. Namun perkara utama yang boleh dipersoal, adakah ia dijual kepada golongan yang disasarkan?

Di Perlis hasil pemerhatian, bekalan beras tempatan ini dijual tidak kira siapa walaupun mengikut had yang ditetapkan.

Beras tempatan ini dikatakan turut dibeli oleh golongan peniaga-peniaga makanan, jadi apa yang tinggal buat keluarga yang rendah pendapatan mereka?

Sehingga kini, tiada mekanisme jelas untuk memastikan agar beras-beras tempatan ini sampai kepada mereka yang berhak.

Mekanisme jualan beras tempatan ini justeru perlu ditetapkan segera. Jika dibiarkan berlarutan, ia hanya mengulang semula apa yang berlaku dalam isu minyak masak peket bersubsidi ketika ini.

Ia membuka ruang kepada isu ketirisan dan penyelewengan. Seperti minyak masak peket, bekalan beras tempatan ini boleh dimanupulasi oleh peniaga, bekalan disorok dan dijual kepada bukan yang layak seperti kepada warga asing.

Langkah pemantauan dan penguatkuasaan tegas untuk mengelakkan perkara seumpamanya daripada berlaku pasti menjadi jawapan pihak bertanggungjawab dalam hal ini.

Tetapi itu bukan jalan penyelesaian sedangkan isu penyelewengan minyak masak peket bersubsidi juga berterusan dilaporkan.

Sehingga kini, minyak masak peket masih sukar didapati di pasaran. Perkara yang sama boleh berlaku dalam isu beras tempatan ini walaupun sememangnya ia sudah berlaku pun, hilang daripada radar, hilang daripada pandangan mata kita semua.

Berhalik dalam soal mahu memastikan hanya yang layak sahaja dapat menerima manfaat, ada cadangan yang menyarankan agar kaedah pemberian subsidi kepada barangan kawalan termasuk beras ini beralih kepada pendekatan lebih berkesan iaitu menerusi bantuan tunai bersasar.

Pendekatan ini dijamin sampai terus kepada golongan memerlukan. Menerusi bantuan tunai, pengguna dalam kalangan kurang berkemampuan ini bebas untuk memilih produk makanan yang diperlukan mereka. Saranan ini wajar untuk diperhalusi kerajaan

Saranan ini wajar untuk diperhalusi kerajaan mengambil kira keperluan setiap orang adalah berbeza dan kadangkala selera juga berubah-ubah.

Langkah ini juga sebenarnya dapat mengurangkan teleanan kerajaan dan kementerian terlibat untuk memulih dan memastikan bekalan beras tempatan untuk sentiasa berada dalam pasaran.

More bazaar locations and lots approved in Johor

JOHOR government has approved 228 bazaars to operate across the state in conjunction with Ramadan and the upcoming Hari Raya Aidilfitri celebration.

State housing and local government committee chairman Datuk Mohd Jafni Md Shukor said from the figure, 200 locations were for Ramadan bazaars while 28 sites were identified for Hari Raya Aidilfitri bazaar.

"This year, a total of 12,757 lots were readied for Ramadan and Hari Raya Aidilfitri bazaars in 228 locations across 16 local councils in Johor.

"This is an increase compared

to 2024, which only had 12,619 lots in 222 locations," he said. Mohd Jafni said Johor Baru City Council (MBJB) had the most number of Ramadan and Hari Raya Aidilfitri bazaar sites,

with 62 locations and 3,199 lots. He said this was followed by Pasir Gudang City Council (MBPG) with 23 locations and 1,560 lots and Kulai Municipal Council (MPKu) with 24 locations and 998 lots.

The councils have imposed basic conditions for traders tak-

ing part in this year's bazaar. The main point is that traders must be Malaysians.

"Foreigners are not allowed to trade at either the Ramadan or Hari Raya Aidilfitri bazaars," he said, reminding traders to abide by the ruling.

The Bukit Permai assemblyman said strict action would be taken by the local councils, including cancelling licences for breach of the ruling.

"At the government level, the

state does not issue Ramadan and Hari Raya Aidilfitri bazaar licences to foreigners.

"If the stalls are rented out to foreigners, the licence will be cancelled immediately.

"Non-governmental organisations or private bodies operating stalls, too, have to comply with the ruling," he added. Mohd Jafni said the period for

organising the Ramadan and Aidilfitri bazaar must not exceed one month while the

type of products sold included food and drinks, as well as items related to Hari Raya

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He said counterfeit, pirated merchandise and goods from overseas were not allowed to be sold at the bazaars.

"Only local goods such as songkok raya, clothes and items to help with preparations for Hari Raya Aidilfitri are wel-come," he said, adding that the type of business was determined by the local councils.

Mohd Jafni said local councils in Johor would also be working closely with Health Ministry to ensure cleanliness in adherence to the Food Act 1983 and other food safety regulations.

"Local councils will also work closely with Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry (KPDN) to ensure traders abide by the Price Control and Anti-

Profiteering Act 2011.

"Traders taking part in both bazaars must display price tags for food, drinks and goods sold.

"If consumers find that some traders are not following rules, they can contact their respective local councils for action to be taken," he advised.

Bazar Ramadan lebih teratur, bersih di bawah seliaan DBKL

PETALING JAYA – Pengurusan bazar Ramadan di Wangsa Maju diuruskan sepenuhnya oleh Dewan Bandaraya Kuala Lumpur (DBKL) memastikan tiada ruang bagi pengusaha menjual tapak pada harga 'kayangan'.

Menteri di Jabatan Perdana Menteri (Wilayah Persekutuan), Dr. Zaliha Mustafa berkata, sewa tapak ditawarkan pada harga RM500 termasuk RM200 sebagai cagaran yang akan dipulangkan jika peniaga mematuhi semua syarat dan peraturan.

Katanya, ini bermakna, peniaga hanya membayar sewa RM300 sahaja untuk tempoh sebulan berniaga.

"Ada segelintir pihak membuat aduan mengenai harga petak bazar Ramadan yang boleh mencecah sehingga ribuan ringgit sehingga peniaga kecil terhimpit dan terpaksa menanggung beban kos yang tinggi.

"Hasil risikan, sebelum ini ada peniaga yang sewa petak bazar kendalian pihak ketiga lebih dari satu petak. Kemudian mereka 'alibaba'kan petak tersebut dengan harga yang tinggi kepada orang tempatan yang memang mahu berniaga pada bulan Ramadan.

"Yang menjadi mangsa adalah peniaga dan penjaja kecil setempat," katanya di akaun TikTok ketika membuat tinjauan di bazar itu.

Menurut Zaliha, dia berpuas hati dengan keadaan bazar di situ dengan rata-rata pengunjung memuji pengurusan kawasan itu yang lebih teratur dan kemas pada tahun ini.
