Deputy minister visits hawker stalls at Gaya Street Sunday market

KOTA KINABALU: Deputy Minister of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) Senator Datuk Dr Hajah Fuziah Salleh visited the Gaya Street Sunday market here.

Accompanied by KPDN Director-general of Enforcement Datuk Azman Adam, Kota Kinabalu City Hall (DBKK) Deputy Director General of Sector Operations Robert Lipon and other KPDN and DBKK senior management, they visited 525 hawker stalls to hear their experiences and space for improvement.

Rakyat diharap terus menikmati barangan keperluan harian pada harga berpatutan

BINTULU: Rakyat diharap akan terus dapat menikmati pembelian barangan keperluan harian pada harga lebih berpatutan menerusi pelaksanaan Jualan RAHMAH yang dikendalikan oleh Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) di bawah Payung RAHMAH.

Timbalan Menteri Infrastruktur dan Pembangunan Pelabuhan Dato Majang Renggi berkata, pelaksanaan Jualan RAHMAH oleh kerajaan adalah untuk memastikan penduduk luar bandar terus mendapat akses kepada barangan keperluan harian pada harga berpatutan antara 10 hingga 30 peratus lebih rendah daripada harga pasaran.

Dengan tawaran harga barangan lebih rendah daripada harga pasaran itu dilihat akan membantu meringankan beban kos sara hidup rakyat.

Beliau berkata demikian semasa merasmikan Program Sejahtera Komuniti MADANI (SejaTi MADANI) dan Jualan RAHMAH Daerah Bintulu 2025 serta Program MEKAR Komuniti Jabatan Pendaftaran Negara (JPN) di Balai Raya Kampung Penan Muslim Batu 10 Jalan Bintulu-Miri semalam.

Turut hadir Pegawai Daerah Bintulu Awang Mohamed Nizam Awang Ali Bohan, Ketua Cawangan KPDN Bintulu Al Redzamani Abdul Razak dan pegawai-pegawai kanan agensi kerajaan yang lainnya.

Dalam pada itu katanya, Program SejaTi MADANI merupakan platform disediakan kepada Jawatankuasa Kemajuan dan Keselamatan Kampung (JKKK) terpilih untuk memasarkan produk tempatan yang seterusnya

untuk mengukuhkan ekonomi komuniti setempat.

Majang yang juga Ahli Dewan Undangan Negeri (ADUN) Samalaju berkata, bagi Program MEKAR Komuniti JPN pula ia membolehkan perkhidmatan pendaftaran rasmi disampaikan terus di lapangan bagi memastikan penduduk pedalaman tidak tercicir dalam memperoleh dokumen pengenalan diri yang sah.

Katanya, keseluruhan inisiatif ini mencerminkan komitmen berterusan kerajaan dalam memastikan setiap rakyat tanpa mengira lokasi dapat menikmati akses terhadap kesejahteraan, kemudahan asas dan peluang pembangunan yang disediakan.

Program MEKAR merupakan inisiatif JPN untuk mendekatkan perkhidmatan kepada rakyat terutama golongan yang menghadapi kesukaran untuk ke pejabat JPN.

Kemudahan disediakan ialah pendaftaran kelahiran, kematian dan permohonan kad pengenalan melalui

perkhidmatan turun padang untuk membantu warga emas dan orang kurang upaya (OKU) dan melalui kaunter bergerak.

Manakala Jualan RAHMAH merupakan inisiatif kerajaan dikendalikan KPDN di bawah Payung RAHMAH untuk membantu rakyat menangani kos sara hidup dengan menawarkan harga barangan keperluan harian lebih rendah sehingga 30 peratus berbanding harga pasaran.

Ia diharap dapat meringankan beban rakyat dan merancakkan ekonomi setempat.

Program SejaTi MADANI pula untuk menggalakkan aktiviti sosioekonomi komuniti di seluruh negara bagi meningkatkan pendapatan dengan menyedekahkan geran sehingga RM100,000 kepada komuniti yang layak.

Inisiatif itu untuk melaksanakan projek dalam tempoh tiga hingga enam bulan untuk pelbagai bidang seperti pertanian, kraf tangan, pelancongan dan kitar semula.

Sarawak mulls Grab's e-sampan to modernise river transport

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KUCHING: The Sarawak government is reviewing a proposal by Grab (Malaysia) Ltd to introduce a 'Grab Sampan Proof of Concept' (PoC) for Sungai Sarawak – a pilot project aimed at modernising and digitalising traditional river transport.

According to Premier Datuk Patinggi Tan Sri Abang Johari Tun Openg, the PoC aims to integrate electric-propulsion 'sampan' (small boat) with digital booking and cashless payment systems, offering a modern upgrade to long-standing river-crossing services.

"This initiative embraces innovation while honouring tradition using electric propulsion and digital platforms to enhance first- and last-mile connectivity along the Sarawak River," he said at the opening of the Sarawak Rivers Day Conference (SRDC) 2025, held in conjunction with World Rivers Day under the theme 'Waterways of Life', here yesterday.

Abang Johari's speech was delivered by Deputy Premier Datuk Amar Dr Sim Kui Hian.

It is informed that Sarawak has 40 major river basins spanning over 123,000 square kilometres.

On clean energy, Abang Johari pointed to the newly-introduced cascading dam Initiative, which harnesses natural river gradients for small-scale hydropower generation.

The pilot will be at Sungai Gaat in Kapit, where the local community has agreed in principle to participate.

"Preliminary studies show that across selected sites, Sarawak has a potential of about 3 GW (gigawatts) of cascading hydro capacity."

"Importantly, this model allows community equity participation giving local residents five to 10 per cent ownership through a community trust."

"Revenue from clean energy will therefore return to the people, funding education, infrastructure, and social development," he said.

Earlier, Minister of Transport Sarawak Dato Sri Lee Kim Shin hailed innovation as key to keeping river transport modern, efficient and relevant in the digital age.

He said the PoC would cover eight designated pick-up and drop-off points along the Kuching Waterfront over a six-month trial period.

He added that his ministry, together with the Sarawak Rivers Board (SRB), would study the proposal to ensure its feasibility and alignment with broader transport objectives.

"This project exemplifies how innovation and digitalisation

can rejuvenate traditional river transport, creating sustainable and inclusive mobility solutions for the people of Sarawak," he said.

Meanwhile, Lee said a total of 5,785 private boats and longboats in Sarawak had been compiled and submitted to the Ministry of Finance (MoF) as supporting data for the targeted Budig5 subsidy, aimed at assisting river-dependent communities across the state.

According to him, this initiative reflects the Sarawak government's commitment under the social inclusivity pillar of Post-Covid-19 Development Strategy (PCDS) 2030, ensuring that the river-dependent communities can continue to receive equitable access to essential support and services.

The compilation of private boats and longboats complements the ongoing implementation of the RON95 petrol subsidy for passenger boats operating in Sarawak," he said.

It is informed that since Oct 9, the SRB has submitted data on more than 208 commercial boats and small vessels registered with River Transport Permits (RTP) to the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN).

"SRB's role includes verifying registered boats with valid RTPs, reviewing data for subsidy eligibility, and ensuring proper oversight to prevent abuse," Lee added.
