KPDN proposes regulating int'l e-commerce platforms

KUALA LUMPUR: The Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) has completed a review of e-commerce laws to improve the regulation of the sector, including foreign platform operators operating in Malaysia.



Its Deputy Minister, Datuk Dr Fuziah Salleh (pic), said the review, which began in April 2022 and was completed on Oct 15 this year, encompasses three main thrusts and 12 areas of legal focus that will form the foundation for the formulation of a new e-commerce law.

"Among the main focuses of this study are enhancing consumer protection, increasing fairness in transactions for all parties and creating specific regulations for online transactions," she said during the question-and-answer session in the Dewan Rakyat today.

She was replying to a question from Mohd Hasnizan Harun (PN-Hulu Selangor) regarding the current guidelines used to determine the terms for foreign e-commerce platforms to enter into the Malaysian market and the ministry's efforts to introduce new and stricter control policies so that market forces are more balanced and do not affect the progress of

local industries.

Fuziah said the results of the study are being finalised in the form of a policy paper to be presented to the Cabinet before being drafted as a new bill to be tabled in Parliament.

"With the new law, we can ensure fairness not only to consumers, but also to traders and platform operators in ensuring a more balanced e-commerce ecosystem," she said.

Fuziah explained that the e-commerce sector is one of the key drivers of the country's digital economic growth, with an income value reaching RM1.184 trillion in 2023 and an expected RM1.65 trillion this year, thus paving the way for new job opportunities and expanding the market for micro, small and medium enterprises (SMEs).

However, so far, she said, only two main acts regulate the sector: the Consumer Protection Act 1999 and the Electronic Commerce Act 2006, in addition to the guidelines on foreign participation in the distributed trade services, which are also used for the entry of foreign e-commerce platforms into the local market.

"As I have said, the economic sector is growing larger, and surely the existing laws are insufficient to cover all the sources of power needed for us to comprehensively regulate the ecosystem," she said.

Meanwhile, regarding the ministry's plans to address the increase in fees, such as commission rates charged by e-commerce platforms to local traders, Fuziah said the rates are determined based on various factors, such as the costs of promotion, advertising, system maintenance and platform technology development.

"In this regard, the ministry is of the view that there needs to be a source of authority that will give it the power to intervene. Currently, we do not have this source of power to determine the commission rates.

"However, if the new law is passed, it will give the KPDN the power to make it compulsory for platform operators to inform the ministry should they want to increase commission rates," she said when replying to a supplementary question from Mohd Hasnizan.

In reply to a supplementary question from Dr Mohammed Taufiq Johari (PH-Sungai Petani) regarding the sovereignty of user data and capital outflow through foreign platforms, Fuziah said that the new law is also proposed to give the ministry the power to monitor cross-border transactions.

"With this source of authority, we can collaborate with other agencies, such as the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission (MCMC), to monitor algorithm issues," she said. —Bernama

IRAMA sambut baik inisiatif Hari Muzik Negara

Konsortium Industri Rakaman Muzik Malaysia (IRAMA) menyambut baik cadangan memperkenalkan Hari Muzik Negara seperti diumumkan Menteri Komunikasi, Datuk Fahmi Fadzil yang dilihat sebagai suatu inisiatif penting dalam memperkukuh peranan dan martabat industri muzik tanah air.

IRAMA dalam kenyataan menyebut cadangan memperkenalkan Hari Muzik Negara mula diusul sejak bekas Menteri Komunikasi dan Multimedia, Gobind Singh, namun pelancarannya tertangguh akibat pandemik COVID-19.

“IRAMA menyokong penuh

cadangan agar tarikh 22 Mac, iaitu tarikh kelahiran Allahyarham Tan Sri P Ramlee dijadikan Hari Muzik Negara.

“Beliau adalah tokoh agung yang menjadi simbol keunggulan seni dan budaya bangsa. Sehubungan itu, IRAMA mencadangkan sambutan Hari Muzik Negara diisi dengan majlis tahlil dan penghargaan khas di Arkib P Ramlee dan program serta aktiviti muzik di seluruh negara.

“IRAMA juga mencadangkan agar diberi penghargaan kepada penggiat muzik dan pengkarya tempatan yang banyak menyumbang kepada pembangunan industri kreatif,” katanya.

Bagaimanapun, dalam merayakan Hari Muzik Negara, pihaknya mengesyorkan agar pelbagai isu dan permasalahan dalam sektor muzik tempatan ditangani.

“IRAMA berpendapat beberapa isu asas dalam industri muzik masih belum mendapat penyelesaian tuntas, iaitu antaranya isu royalti yang berlarutan sejak era Music Rights Malaysia (MRM) di mana masih kabur dari segi ketelusan agihan serta struktur pemantauan yang adil kepada semua pemegang hak.

“Selain itu, isu tadbir urus badan Collection Management Organisation (CMO) yang masih kurang menyeluruh, di mana

penglibatan pemegang taruh utama seperti penerbit rakaman dan artis sering diketepi sedangkan penerbit *publishing* lebih diutamakan,” katanya.

IRAMA berpendapat peranan pelbagai Kementerian seperti Kementerian Pelancongan, Seni dan Budaya (MOTAC); Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) dan Kementerian Komunikasi dalam pembangunan muzik masih belum menunjukkan penelurusan kuat serta hala tuju bersama yang jelas memacu industri ini secara bersepadu.

IRAMA berharap Perbadanan Muzik Negara yang sudah dilan-

carkan dan mempunyai Lembaga Pengarah, dapat berfungsi sepenuhnya sebagai badan penelurusan utama yang menjaga kepentingan seluruh ekosistem muzik termasuk rakaman, persembahan, penulisan, penerbitan dan pendidikan.

“Dengan penelurusan yang lebih menyeluruh antara kerajaan, agensi dan penggiat muzik, IRAMA yakin masa depan industri muzik Malaysia mampu melonjak semula.

“Ini bukan sahaja dari sudut hiburan, malah, sebagai suatu sektor ekonomi kreatif dan budaya berimpak tinggi,” katanya.

Penguatkuasaan di Sabah perlu lebih agresif – David Chan

KOTA KINABALU: Pengerusi Yayasan Pengguna Negara Malaysia (YPNM) Cawangan Sabah, David Chan (GAMBAR), menggesa agensi penguatkuasaan di negeri ini bertindak lebih agresif dan tegas bagi meningkatkan keyakinan rakyat terhadap sistem pentadbiran dan undang-undang.

Beliau berkata, masyarakat kini mahu melihat tindakan segera dan menyeluruh daripada pihak berkuasa, khususnya dalam menangani isu penipuan pengguna, penyeludupan barangan kawalan serta pelanggaran hak pengguna yang masih kerap berlaku.

"Kita tidak boleh hanya bertindak selepas menerima aduan atau apabila isu tular. Penguatkuasaan perlu bersifat proaktif dan berterusan supaya



agensi seperti Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri (KPDN), Kastam Diraja Malaysia, Polis Diraja Malaysia (PDRM) dan Kementerian Kesihatan (KKM) bagi memastikan keberkesanan tindakan di

rakyat yakin undang-undang dilaksanakan secara adil," katanya dalam satu kenyataan.

David turut mencadangkan agar penguatkuasaan dijalankan secara bersepadu antara pelbagai

semua peringkat.

"Apabila rakyat melihat agensi kerajaan bekerjasama secara profesional, ia akan mengembalikan keyakinan terhadap kejujuran dan integriti sistem penguatkuasaan di Sabah," ujarnya.

Menurut beliau, YPNM Sabah akan terus bekerjasama dengan pihak berkuasa untuk menyalurkan maklumat serta aduan daripada pengguna, selain memperkukuh kesedaran awam tentang kepentingan melindungi hak masing-masing.

"Penguatkuasaan bukan sekadar menghukum, tetapi juga mendidik dan mencegah. Rakyat perlu merasai bahawa hak mereka dilindungi dan suara mereka didengari," katanya.-JT

Raid nets 33 suspects, RM4M in contraband

KUCHING: Smugglers across Sarawak are feeling the heat after a two-week operation by the General Operations Force (GOF) dismantled multiple illegal trade networks and seized contraband worth more than RM4.04 million.

The raids — conducted under Ops Taring Alpha, Ops Taring Bravo, and Ops Taring Batas/Awas between Oct 14 and 27 — also saw 33 suspects, aged between 16 and 58, taken into custody for smuggling, storing and selling duty-not-paid

goods.

Sarawak GOF Brigade Commander SAC Lim Bak Phai said of the total, 28 were locals and five were foreigners.

“The biggest breakthrough came on Oct 14 in Sibu, when the 10th Battalion uncovered a large-scale illegal alcohol storage facility managed by five suspects, including two Indonesians.

“The raid led to the seizure of 24,552 litres of untaxed beer worth RM859,320, along with a pickup truck and semi-trailer with two containers valued at RM320,000.

“Nine days later (Oct 23), another major operation in the same district, exposed a diesel misappropriation racket involving 14 suspects, one of them a 16-year-old.

“It led to the confiscation of 38,800 litres of diesel, 16 storage tanks, six machines, and nine vehicles worth over RM1 million,” he said.

In addition to the major busts, other operations have led to 14 more arrests and seizures across Kuching, Sibu, Kota

Samarahan, Bintulu, Sri Aman, and Lundu.

Lim stated that GOF personnel uncovered various illegal activities involving the sale and storage of 736,456 of untaxed cigarettes, 4,294.56 litres of beers, 200 litres of diesel, and 16 gas cylinders, with overall seizures worth over RM1.8 million.

The suspects and seizures have since been handed over to the respective district police headquarters (IPD), Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN), and the Ministry of Utility and Telecommunication for further action.

All of the cases are being investigated under various laws such as the Customs Act 1967, Immigration Act 1959/63, the Control of Supplies Act 1961, and the Gas Distribution Ordinance 2016.

Between Jan 1 and Oct 27, the Sarawak GOF Brigade have recorded a staggering seizure value of RM381.8 million involving 500 cases.

To date, 608 individuals (474 locals and 134 foreigners) have been arrested, and 319 vehicles of various types have been confiscated.

（怡保28日讯）本地菜价低迷，加上大量外国进口菜输入本地市场抢滩，导致金马仑出现部分菜农陷入经营困境，甚至出现倒闭、转行及欠债等情况！

据了解，上述情况早在去年6月开始已出现恶化，在今年尤为严重，菜价今年也相对低迷，虽然金马仑菜农倒闭、转行及欠债等情况未达太严重地步，但是如果情势持续恶化，恐出现更大规模的倒闭潮。

金马仑菜农曾纪俊接受《中国报》访问时指出，在人口菜冲击本地市场的课题上，中国的进口蔬菜冲击最为明显，但同时，越南、泰国及印尼等国家的蔬菜同样进入本地市场，进一步压缩了本地菜农的生存空间。

本地市场供应过剩

“除了外国进口菜涌入外，本地市场供应过剩亦是造成价格崩跌的主因之一，金马仑蔬菜产量庞大，消耗速度跟不上，导致价格持续下滑，菜农根本无利可图。”他说，目前已有菜农因支撑不住而选择

曾纪俊说，金马仑多个菜农公会此前已代表业者

向政府和农业部反映问题，希望当局采取措施，适度管控外国进口蔬菜数量，以维持市场平衡。他坦言，虽然公会已与政府对话，但成效有限，近年情况反而更加恶化。

“其实，最有效的解决方案，

就是政府需要管控外国蔬菜输入国内的情况，如此就可稳定国内市场价格，一旦价格稳了，接下来的问题自然会迎刃而解。”

曾纪俊强调，业者所要的是双赢局面，即能让农民能维持生计之际，消费者也能以合理价钱购得日常所需的蔬菜。

小园主纷纷转行卖地

金马仑菜农公会署理主席刘永顺指出，外国人口菜冲击本地市场已持续一年多，情况愈发严重，小园主首当其冲，纷纷转行、抵押或出售土地，农业生态正陷入危机。

他说，自去年6月起，金马仑农民已陆续感受到进口菜带来的影响，尤其来自中国、泰国及越南的蔬菜大量涌入市场，压低本地菜价，因此很多菜农宁愿把地出租或卖掉，不想再继续种植。

“目前，只有规模较大、具备一站式流式即自种、自运、自销的企业仍能维持盈利，反观小园主则亏损连连，可见现在已不是不差的问题，基本上是达到人人皆亏的情况。”

刘永顺指出，中国菜不仅占据市场，也影响到餐饮业采购习惯，很多中国餐馆都只买中国菜，除非中国那边没货，他们才会采用本地蔬菜，而除了中国入口菜之外，泰国及越南入口蔬菜也入侵了本地市场，印尼蔬菜则较少。

刘永顺建议，政府应就进口蔬菜采取保护措施，以维持本地农业的竞争力。

他举例，如果国内已能自给80%以上的本地蔬菜，比如小白菜、菜心、番茄、青瓜等常见菜类，那这些进口蔬菜就应征收销售与服务税（SST）；至于国内没有生产的蔬菜，如红萝卜、西兰花、蒜头、洋葱等，则不应被征税。

他认为，这样的做法可在增加国家收入的同时，保护本地农民，也确保消费者仍能合理价位购买各种蔬菜。

“政府若在进口蔬菜上合理征税，一方面能稳住农民生计，一方面又能确保市场健康发展。”

刘永顺也提及，政府理应检讨对农民不公的政策，并举例，渔民渔民可补贴柴油，但农民用在推土机、发电机、水泵等农业设备的柴油，却得用原价购买，这有差别对待之嫌；同时，农业肥料及农药皆无获补贴，加上金马仑土地是国内土地租金最高的地区，让农民负担非常沉重。

“农民也是国家粮食安全的重要支柱，理应获得公平对待与政策支持，希望国家能一视同仁，真正保护本地农民与中小型农业企业，让粮食供应永续发展。”

本地菜价低到离谱

在金马仑巴登威利及罗京高原则拥有菜园的农民林玮聪（29岁）指出，近半年来金马仑蔬菜市场价格暴跌，许多农民叫苦连天，不少人更因无法支撑成本而选择放弃经营，宁愿把菜园或土地出租，甚至退场。

他说，他本身虽然只是基层农民，但也明显感受到进口蔬菜对本地市场造成的冲击；他说，他并不清楚具体的政策问题，但可以确定的是，菜价真的低到离谱，农民撑不下去了。

“农民并非反对进口蔬菜，而是希望政府加强管控与监督，保障本地市场的稳定，保障我们农民的生计。”

林玮聪说，目前金马仑许多农民只是在“守”著这个行业，不敢扩展或奢望利润，能撑下去就已经不错了。

林玮聪希望，政府应深入探讨价格长期低迷原因，找出解决方案，以稳定市场与保障本地农业发展，因为菜价低到不合逻辑，农民真的撑不了多久，政府除了调查原因，也要制定适当的管控机制，让农民能安心种植。
