Harga sardin tidak naik melampau

Produk dijual berbeza di pasar raya, kedai runcit untuk berat dan jenama sama

Kuala Lumpur: Sardin dijual pada harga berbeza di pasar raya dan kedai runcit untuk berat serta jenama sama.

Tinjauan *BH* menunjukkan tiada kenaikan harga yang melampau bagi semua produk sardin seperti didakwa sesetengah pihak.

Beberapa pasar raya di ibu kota menjual sardin pada harga RM8.40 dan juga RM10.05.

Menurut pekerja pasar raya yang tidak mahu dikenali, harga sardin itu masih sama sejak minggu lalu.

"Sekiranya kami ingin meningkatkan harga barang, kami tidak akan menaikkan sekali gus sehingga RM3. Jika kami melakukan perkara itu, sudah pasti pelanggan kami akan berkunjung ke pasar raya yang lain," katanya.

Beliau juga turut mencadangkan sekiranya harga sardin mahal, pengguna boleh membeli sardin keluaran tempatan pada harga RM4.35.

Sebelum ini di media sosial, pengguna Tattyraana Ismail II mendakwa harga sardin dalam tin meningkat kepada RM13.30

berbanding RM10.80 bulan lalu.

Menerusi kirimannya lagi, Tattyraana berkata, sardin dahulu boleh dibeli ketika tidak mempunyai wang.

Nasi naik sehingga RM13.30

Bagaimanapun, beberapa hari lalu, Menteri Perdagangan Islam Negeri dan Kos Sarawak Hidup (KPDN), Datuk Seri Salahuddin Ayub membatal kiriman dan menafikan dakwaan pengguna itu di ruangan komen dengan memaparkan harga RM9.40 bagi setiap tin sardin.

"Pengesahan terkini dari Mydin dan Econserve tiada kenaikan sehingga RM13.30. Sila

dapatkan fakta yang betul," katanya menerusi Facebook.

Menerusi carian *BH* pula, akaun pengguna media sosial sudah tidak dapat ditemui.

Pada masa sama, *BH* juga melakukan tinjauan terhadap harga Beras Putih Tempatan (BPT) dan juga Beras Putih Import (BPI).

Hasil tinjauan mendapati BPT masih lagi kekal dengan harga RM26.00 bagi setiap 10 kilogram (kg) ataupun RM2.60 bagi setiap satu kilogram. Sementara itu bagi BPT masing-masing dijual dengan harga RM29.69 dan juga RM28.49.

Terdahulu *BH* melaporkan, KPDN dengan kerjasama Ke-

menterian Pertanian dan Keterjaminan Makanan melancarkan OP Jamin bagi memastikan bekalan beras putih tempatan (BPT) mencukupi.

Operasi yang dijalankan selama sebulan bermula 7 Julai lalu, turut berperanan bagi memastikan BPT dijual pada harga terkawal iaitu RM2.60 sekilogram.

Menurut Ketua Penggarah Kawselia Padi dan Beras, Datuk Azman Mahmood, kekurangan BPT pada beberapa minggu lalu mungkin berpunca daripada kebanyakkan BPI yang naik harga daripada RM28 ke RM32. Ada antara pengguna beralih kepada beras tempatan.

Pembedahan berjaya, masih dipantau di ICU

Menteri Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup, Datuk Seri Salahuddin Ayub yang sedang dirawat dan selesai menjalani pembedahan di Hospital Sultanah Bahiyah (HSB) di Alor Setar pada Sabtu, dilaporkan berada dalam keadaan stabil.

Menteri Kesihatan, Dr Zaliha Mustafa memaklumkan pihaknya melawat Salahuddin yang juga Ahli Parlimen Pulai pada Ahad untuk mengetahui lebih lanjut perkembangannya.

"Keadaannya (Salahuddin) stabil, kita doakan insya-ALLAH beliau sihat. Pembedahan semalam (Sabtu) alhamdulillah berjaya dan kita sedang memantau keadaan

beliau di unit rawatan rapi (ICU)," katanya.

Sementara itu, anak perempuan Salahuddin, Siti Fatihah memohon agar ruang diberikan kepada pihak keluarga sahaja untuk melawat.

Menerusi satu kenyataan, beliau berkata, perkara itu adalah atas nasihat doktor dan permintaan ahli keluarga.

"Bagi pihak keluarga, kami menghargai segala sokongan dan doa. Saya juga mohon semua agar terus mendoakan keadaan ayah saya," katanya.

Siti Fatihah turut memaklumkan bapanya kini masih dalam penjagaan dan pemantauan rapi pasukan perubatan Hospital Sultanah Bahiyah, di sini. - Bernama

Tributes pour in for Salahuddin

A loss for the nation, says PM as friends and foes mourn hardworking minister

PETALING JAYA: Datuk Seri Salahuddin Ayub passed away at Hospital Sultanah Bahiyah in Kedah yesterday. He was 61.

The death of the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Minister was confirmed in a Facebook post by his daughter Fatihah Salahuddin last night.

As his death was confirmed tributes poured in from his Cabinet colleagues and other national leaders.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim said that Salahuddin's demise was a personal loss to him and the country as the nation had lost a hardworking minister.

"I am much affected as I have lost a good friend as he was with me in the struggle until the end of his life. His deeds can never be repaid."

"He is well known for his unflawed character by both his friends and foes. A person who is hardworking, trustworthy and responsible. Rest, my dear friend," said Anwar.

Deputy Prime Ministers Datuk Seri Dr Ahmad Zahid Hamidi and Datuk Seri Fadillah Yusof also said Salahuddin was known for his earnestness in carrying out his duties.

"He was much respected, humble, committed and dedicated to his responsibilities as a minister," said Ahmad Zahid.

"We have lost a humble and

hardworking minister," said Fadillah, who is currently in Saudi Arabia.

His fellow Johor MP and MCA president Datuk Seri Dr Wee Ka Siong said the loss would be felt by the Johor people.

"All his deeds to the people and the country will be remembered forever. His passing is a big loss to the people, especially to Johoreans," said Dr Wee.

Amanah president and Agriculture and Food Security Minister Datuk Seri Mohamad Sabu said it was indeed a very sad day.

"It is a very sad day for all Amanah members as we have lost our dear deputy president Salahuddin," said Mohamad.

Communications and Digital Minister Fahmi Fadil said Salahuddin had made significant contributions to the country.

"He introduced the concept of Payung Rahmah, Menu Rahmah, Jualan Rahmah and many more to help those in need," said Fahmi.

Meanwhile, Opposition Leader and Perikatan Nasional secretary-general Datuk Seri Hamzah Zainuddin said that although they were on opposite sides, he held

Salahuddin in high esteem.

"He was a politician I respected as he was a mature, progressive and pragmatic leader," said Hamzah.

Caretaker Kedah Menteri Besar Datuk Seri Mohamad Sanusi Md Nor said Salahuddin was a "gentleman".

"He was always composed and calm. In our early years in PAS, we used to attend PAS programmes together. Once we slept under the table. He was always humble and committed to his struggle. Condolences to his family," said Mohamad Sanusi.

Salahuddin, who was Johor Pakatan Harapan chief and Amanah deputy president, was in the intensive care unit of Hospital Sultanah Bahiyah in Alor Setar after he suffered a brain haemorrhage on Friday.

On July 21, the minister's press secretary Syakirin Husnal had said that Salahuddin was rushed to the hospital after experiencing nausea and vomiting.

Born in Pontian, Johor, to Malay-Chinese parents, Salahuddin graduated from Universiti Putra Malaysia and worked in a bank before he ventured into politics.

In 1999, he joined PAS and contested the Johor state seat of Benut but lost.

He then contested for the parliamentary seat of Kubang Kerian in Kelantan in 2004 and won. He retained the seat in the 2008 general election.

In 2013, he returned to his hometown in Johor and contested the parliamentary seat of Pulai but lost to Barisan Nasional's Nur Jazlan Mohamed.

However, in 2018, after breaking away from PAS three years earlier and forming Amanah, he contested under the Pakatan Harapan ticket and won both the Pulai parliamentary seat and the Johor state seat of Simpang Jeram.

He retained Pulai in the 15th General Election last year and the Simpang Jeram state seat in the Johor state election in 2022.

He is expected to be laid to rest today in his home state.
