国内贸易及生活费部联邦直辖区吉隆坡分局日前在官网接获消费者的投诉后，联合马六甲国内贸易及生活费部到蕉赖皇后镇（Bandar Sri Permaisuri），皇后路的商店展开“便衣行动（OPS SAMAR）”以测试购买食用油。

“试购时，销售员告知食用油已售完，由于对销售员给出的理由表示怀疑和不满，之后身穿制服的官员及执法员进入该场所进行彻底检查并与一名自称是主管的男子碰面，结果发现仓库内存放着数十箱包装食用油。”

当局指出，该案将引

用1961年供应法令16A(1)(b)条文（拒绝出售统制品）进行调查，一旦罪成，个人将面对罚款不超过100万令吉或监禁不超过3年或两者兼施，若是公司将面对罚款不超过200万令吉。

SSM National Conference 2024 Highlights Enhancing Transparency, Building Resilience for Robust Corporate Growth

SSMNC2024: Shaping the Future of Corporate Governance through Transparency and Resilience

In today's ever-changing global economy, the demand for corporate transparency and the necessity of business resilience have never been more pressing.

Understanding the gravity of these obligations, the Companies Commission of Malaysia (SSM) recently organised its 13th National Conference (SSMNC2024) with the apt theme of 'Enhancing Corporate Transparency, Building Resilience'.

"Last year, we set a record with over 3,000 participants, signifying the conference's growing importance in shaping the corporate landscape."

"This year, we yet again reaffirmed the success with the participation of over 3,000 delegates."



Designed to be a dynamic platform, the conference aimed to deepen the understanding of board members and corporate professionals on strategies to bolster resilience and enhance corporate transparency. It addressed the current challenges and opportunities in today's rapidly evolving business environment.

"This two-day virtual conference, held from 27 August until 28 August 2024, was officially launched by the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KDN) Minister Datuk Armaniz Mohd Ali."

The conference saw the participation of distinguished local and international corporate leaders including representatives from the Corporate Registers Forum members in Singapore, Hong Kong, Tunisia, the Republic of Kiribati and South Africa.

SSM Chairman Ahmad Sabah Yusof in his welcome address, shared that over the years, nearly 10,000 delegates have benefited from the opportunities to learn, network and grow from the SSM National Conference.

"Transparency is a powerful magnet for investment. Thus, the increasing demand for corporate accountability is propelling Malaysian businesses towards greater transparency, driven by regulatory mandates and the growing awareness of its strategic value."



"In an era marked by evolving operational demands, transparency goes beyond compliance. It establishes a strong foundation for ethical conduct and accountability. By prioritising transparency, businesses can better manage risks, foster robust relationships with stakeholders and set themselves as embodiments of good governance that will entail sustainability."

"Malaysia, under the stewardship of Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim, introduced the Malaysia MADANI concept that emphasises inclusivity, integrity, and accountability at its core – values that are essential to corporate transparency."

"Transparency is a powerful magnet for investment. Thus, the increasing demand for corporate accountability is propelling Malaysian businesses towards greater transparency, driven by regulatory mandates and the growing awareness of its strategic value," he said.

Reinforcing the same opinion, SSM Chief Executive Officer Datuk Nor Azimah Abdul Aziz in her address on the conference theme, said "enhancing corporate transparency, building resilience," was chosen to reflect the multifaceted challenges and opportunities in today's rapidly evolving business landscape.

"In an era marked by evolving operational demands, transparency goes beyond compliance. It establishes a strong foundation for ethical conduct and accountability. By prioritising transparency, businesses can better manage risks, foster robust relationships with stakeholders and set themselves as embodiments of good governance that will entail sustainability."

The amendments seek to enhance corporate transparency regarding BO reporting, support enforcement activities against money laundering, terrorist financing, corruption, and other serious crimes, and support the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) evaluations on Malaysia in 2024/2025.

Plenary 1's fireside chat with SSM Corporate Compliance Division Director Norhaiza Jemom, discussed this at length, focusing on the key changes to the BO reporting requirements.

Moderated by broadcast journalist Nadia S Hassan, the session highlighted the evolving expectations for companies, emphasising the importance of adapting to new regulatory standards to ensure transparency. These updates are poised to increase corporate accountability and companies are advised to closely monitor these developments to ensure compliance with the latest reporting obligations. The conversation underscored that proactive compliance will not only mitigate risks but also bolster trust with stakeholders.

Norhaiza explained that through the BO provisions in the act, SSM aims to ensure that anyone wanting to do business in Malaysia must disclose the persons behind their operations. She emphasised that transparency is crucial in maintaining the integrity of the business environment.

"If you do not have any criminal intent, there is no reason to avoid disclosure," she said.

Norhaiza also highlighted that with the advent of technology, companies can now be set up from anywhere, which presents opportunities for unscrupulous parties to exploit the system for activities like money laundering. She stressed that Malaysia cannot afford to have its business environment associated with criminal activities.

While she acknowledged that the enhanced BO reporting requirements may impose an additional burden on businesses, she emphasised that this is a global standard, not just limited to Malaysia."

"You have to accept that if you do business, transparency must be accounted for as well," she noted.

As of 30 September 2024, 57,082 out of 683,580 active companies in SSM's registry, have complied with the requirement to lodge beneficial ownership information with a 84.13% compliance rate.

Companies (Amendment) Act 2024: Enhancing Corporate Governance

As part of continuous effort to ensure high levels of governance among companies, SSM has maintained improvements to several provisions in the Companies Act 2016 aimed towards promoting compliance and facilitating the ease of business through the Companies (Amendment) Act 2024.

Plenary 2's fireside chat with SSM Regulatory Development & Services Division Senior Manager Yap Weng Seong, delved into these amendments in greater detail, particularly on Chester Policy 4 focuses on enhancing corporate governance and practices.

Among the main amendments that was elaborated in the session was the utilisation of SSM's official website for the publication of information and gazettes, replacing the legislative requirement for addressing practical issues in light of the reduced circulation of physical newspapers throughout Malaysia.

Yap explained that in Malaysia, the cost of advertising continues to rise each year, whether through online platforms or traditional print media. He also said that newspaper circulation is gradually declining as more people transition to digital media, so that it can stay affordable for the purpose of entering a compromise agreement with its creditors.

"Thus, we wanted to support the corporate community by establishing a dedicated platform. Simultaneously, this platform will function as a central point of reference."

He added that through the SSM website, users can access advertisements in Bahasa Malaysia and English on a single platform, making it convenient for corporate entities and individuals alike.

Companies (Amendment) Act 2024: Strengthening Corporate Rehabilitation Framework

SSM Regulatory Development & Services Division Director Norhaizinda Salleh, who moderated the session, explained that among the highlights of the amendment is on expanding the application of corporate rescue mechanisms, such as Corporate Voluntary Arrangements (CVA) and Judicial Management (JM).

"CVA is an intervention with creditors without the arrangement of the court. Court intervention under CVA is very minimal which is only to the extent of lodging the paper. The stack of papers to court which will trigger the moratorium of CVA, it's less formal and the moratorium period given to the company undergoing CVA is actually shorter."

"SSM has taken the initiative to widen the scope of CVA under the Companies Act to be extended to all companies regardless of whether the company has security interests over its assets or otherwise," she said.

Meanwhile, she said SSM has also widened the scope of application of JM through the amendment.

"JM is a more formal rescue mechanism where company or creditor may apply to court for the appointment of a JM. Once you apply for a moratorium application to place a company under JM, companies are given an interim moratorium of about 60 days as per our company's C&M rules."

"Once a company is approved to be under JM, a period of six months will be accorded to them. That period of moratorium can be extended to a further period as the court demonstrates."

"Amendment was done to section 40, the application is now extended to all companies including public listed companies," she said.

She also shared the rationale behind strengthening the Scheme of Arrangement or Compromise (SOAC) which is used to restructure a company to make it more viable, so that it can stay afloat for the purpose of entering a compromise agreement with its creditors.

She added that since the directors and management of the company still have full control over the company, rehabilitation plan under SOAC have a better prospect to successfully turn the company around.

Norhaizinda highlighted the enhancements to the Act, noting that amendments were made to Section 362 and new provisions were introduced,

including Sections 368(1A), 368B, and 368D to strengthen the SOAC framework by providing clarification relating to moratorium, the role of insolvency practitioners, rescue financing as well as cram down.

The session was also joined by panelists Singapore BlackOak LLC Director, Lim Chee Wee, Partnership Managing Partner Lee Shih and PwC Malaysia Head of Business Restructuring Services Victor Saw.

SSM Talks

Plenary 11

Mohamad Zainal Abidin, SSM Regulatory Services Division Director, moderated the session, explaining that the introduction of a new 'envelope' icon, centralising all reporting activities. Maritz said this feature will streamline processes, allowing users to retrieve reports more efficiently and is expected to significantly reduce the volume of inquiries and calls to SSM.

Following Maritz's session, SSM Regulatory Services Division & Services Division Manager Mohamad Zainal Abidin Ahmad, updated the delegates about the Limited Liability Partnership (Amendment) Bill 2024 which was passed in Dewan Negara on 3 July 2024.

According to Mohamad Zainal Abidin, the Bill reduces two key objectives which are to bolster economic growth and enhance national well-being, while also promoting transparency in corporate governance.

"A Limited Liability Partnership is an alternative business form in Malaysia that combines features of a company and a partnership. It provides limited liability to its partners."

"The Limited Liability Partnership (Amendment) Bill 2024 encompasses 13 clauses relating to those policy clusters," he said, adding that the Bill is currently awaiting Royal Assent.

Mohamad Zainal Abidin also explained the rationale of introducing BO framework into the Limited Liability Partnership (Amendment) Bill 2024.

"As we are aware, the Companies (Amendment) Act 2024 has been passed in Parliament last year and enforced on 1 April 2024. Among the amendments are those related to BO."

"The Beneficial Ownership framework introduced under the Limited Liability Partnership (Amendment) Bill 2024, will align with the international standard set by the FATF and the OECD, so that when Malaysia is re-evaluated at a later date, the entities similar to companies in the form of LLP will also be subject to the same regulations and policies," he said.

The session was wrapped up by SSM Marketing & Business Development Division Senior Manager Aliah Abdullah who deliberated SSM's revamped Customer Care (SSMCC).

"The primary objective of establishing SSMCC was to ensure that customers' complaints and inquiries are addressed in an integrated, centralised system and to improve the quality of SSM's customer service experience," she said.

Aliah said SSMCC currently offers customers varied support channels including Webform, Knowledge Hub, Chatbot and Live chat.

Penduduk risau berdepan risiko jenayah akibat kebanyakan kumpulan berkenaan

Sekumpulan warga asing dilihat menjadikan kawasan tepi longkang sebagai tempat berkumpul sehingga mengganggu ketenteraman awam.



Warga asing dilihat sesuka hati menjadikan taman permainan awam di flat Pandan Mewah sebagai tempat mereka berniaga.

Penduduk flat Pandan Mewah di sini meluahkan rasa bimbang dan kecewa apabila isu lambakan warga asing dipercayai tidak mempunyai dokumen sah selain pemegang kad Suruhanjaya Tinggi Pertubuhan Bangsa-Bangsa Bersatu (UNHCR) tidak dapat ditangani dengan berkesan. Berikutan itu, wartawan *Sinar Harian* telah membuat tinjauan di kawasan penempatan itu bagi memastikan dakwaan terbabit.

Tinjauan mendapati, penempatan itu merangkumi 12 blok selain terdapat beberapa premis perniagaan termasuk kedai makan, kedai runcit dan kedai cuci kenderaan.

Kawasan itu turut dilengkapi dengan padang permainan, namun tinjauan mendapati lokasi itu ibarat dikuasai 'orang luar' terutama pada waktu petang seawal jam 5 petang.

Ada yang berniaga pakaian, makanan dan peralatan dapur seperti pinggan, periuk dan mangkuk.

Mereka yang dipercayai tidak mempunyai dokumen sah perjalanan dilihat bebas bergerak selain bekerja di premis perniagaan selain menjual barangan di kaki lima yang mana rata-rata pembeli terdiri daripada orang mereka juga.

Warga tempatan yang melalui kawasan kedai mereka ibarat seperti berada di lokasi asing biar pun tempat itu berada di Ampang, Selangor, malah berhampiran dengan sebuah hospital kerajaan.

Pengerusi Kawasan Rukun Tetangga (KRT) Taman Pandan

Mewah, Abd Haffidz Md Noor mendakwa, warga tempatan di sini sudah biasa diganggu oleh warga asing kerana jumlah mereka lebih ramai.

"Warga asing di sini biasanya akan duduk berkumpul di simpang dan kedai makan terutama pada sebelah petang selepas pulang bekerja. Jumlahnya bertambah apabila hujung minggu.

"Kebahagiaan dan keharmonian masyarakat tempatan terganggu dengan kebanyakan warga asing," katanya ketika ditemui *Sinar Harian*.

Beliau berkata, berdasarkan bancian yang KRT lakukan di sini sebanyak 60 peratus penduduk adalah warga asing dari

Myanmar, Pakistan, Indonesia, Bangladesh, Nepal.

Menurutnya, suasana kawasan di sini juga seolah-olah jenayah di luar negara.

Malah katanya, kes mabuk dan bergaduh itu sudah menjadi perkara biasa.

Tambah Abd Haffidz, antara kerisauan utama penduduk tempatan di sini ialah keselamatan anak-anak yang terdedah kepada risiko jenayah.

Ditanya berapakah harga bayaran sewa yang dibayar warga asing, beliau mendedahkan, kadar sewaan mencecah RM1,000 sebulan.

Ujarnya, warga asing ini akan berkongsi rumah secara beramai-ramai.

Jelasnya, nasib penduduk setempat terancam kerana kelesaan dan isu ini telah lama berlanjutan sejak 2009.

"Apa akan jadi dengan masa depan warga tempatan? Saya cadangkan untuk di-

tempatkan pusat operasi bersepadu membabitkan pihak polis, imigresen dan pihak berkuasa tempatan.

"Harap ada tindakan proaktif daripada kerajaan untuk menangani isu ini," katanya.

Selamba berniaga

Selain itu, terdapat beberapa premis runcit yang dipercayai diusahakan warga asing beroperasi tanpa mematuhi peraturan yang ditetapkan Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN).

Tinjauan mendapati ada antara barang yang dijual seperti sayur dan ikan tidak diletakkan tanda harga.

Premis juga dijaga oleh warga asing dari Myanmar dan Bangladesh.

Ketika ditanya, mereka mendakwa hanya bekerja dan premis milik warga tempatan.

Premis-premis runcit itu turut menjual beberapa barangan bersubsidi seperti minyak masak paket serta gula pasir.
