Stok vaksin influenza yang dipasarkan di negara ini dijangka mencukupi sehingga Februari 2026, kata **Timbalan Menteri Kesihatan Datuk Lukanisman Awang Sauni**.

Lukanisman berkata, ia berdasarkan maklum balas diterima daripada Pemasang Pendaftaran Produk (PRH) sehingga 24 Oktober lalu.

"Bahagian Regulatori Farmasi Negara (NPRA) juga melaksanakan mekanisme Pelaporan Gangguan dan Pemberhentian Bekalan Ubat secara sukarela mulai 1 Ogos 2025.

"Semakan melalui sistem Pelaporan sehingga 18 November 2025 mendapati tiada pelaporan rasmi diterima berkaitan gangguan bekalan vaksin influenza sehingga ke tarikh ini," katanya pada sesi soal jawab lisan di Dewan Negara semalam.

Beliau menjawab soalan **Senator Dr A. Lingeshwaran** yang ingin tahu status terkini stok vaksin influenza memandangkan terdapat peningkatan kes dan permintaan vaksin sehingga banyak negeri kehabisan stok.

Lukanisman berkata, setakat 10 November lalu, fasiliti kesihatan Kementerian Kesihatan (KKM) mempunyai 4,044 dos dan 2,881 dos vaksin masing-masing bagi memenuhi aktiviti suntikan kepada petugas kesihatan dan warga emas.

Beliau berkata, terdapat tujuh vaksin influenza

Mengulas sama ada kerajaan mempertimbangkan program subsidi vaksin influenza bagi mengelakkan kesesakan di fasiliti kesihatan, pihaknya mempertimbangkan kaedah terbaik dan melihat peruntukan diterima pada Belanjawan 2026 untuk mengurangkan beban masyarakat yang memerlukan suntikan itu.

Sementara itu, Lukanisman berkata, KKM mempertimbangkan memperluas Program Penyumbeluran Perkhidmatan Hospital (HSOP) yang setakat ini dilaksanakan untuk perkhidmatan imbasan *positron emission tomography* (PET) iaitu ujian imbasan perubatan yang digunakan untuk melihat fungsi organ dalam badan dan pengimejan resonans magnetik (MRI).

"Kami fikir kaedah sama untuk memberi perkhidmatan bagi *allied science* sebagai contoh *speech therapy* yang memerlukan tempoh menunggu sangat panjang," katanya.

Influenza vaccines adequate through Feb, says Lukanisman

KUALA LUMPUR: The stock of influenza vaccines marketed in the country is expected to be sufficient until next February, said Deputy Health Minister Datuk Lukanisman Awang Sauni.

He said this is based on feedback received from the product registration holder (PRH) as of Oct 24.

The National Pharmaceutical Regulatory Agency (NPRA) has also implemented the voluntary Reporting of Medicine Shortage and Discontinuation mechanism since Aug 1.

"Checks via the Reporting system, as of Nov 18, found that no official complaints have been received regarding disruptions to the Influenza vaccine supply up to that date," he said during the oral question-and-answer session in the Dewan Negara Monday.

He was replying to a question from Senator Dr A. Lingeshwaran, who wanted to know the latest status of the influenza vaccine stockpile since there has been a spike in cases and demand for vaccines, with many states running out of stock.

Lukanisman said that as of Nov 10, the Ministry of Health (MOH) health facilities had a total of 4,044 doses of vaccine for health workers and 2,881 doses for

the elderly.

There are seven influenza vaccines containing the inactivated influenza virus type A (H3N2) strains that have been registered in Malaysia, such as Vaxigrip Influenza Vaccine, Vaxigrip Tetra, Influvac Tetra, Influvac Suspension for Injection, as well as three SKYCellflu products in trivalent and quadrivalent forms, he said.

"Since early this year, Malaysia has imported a total of 2,609,235 doses. There were five deliveries totalling 429,130 doses that arrived on Nov 25 and Nov 30 and one arriving on Dec 9," he said.

Replying to a supplementary question from Lingeshwaran on price controls for influenza vaccines in the private market, Lukanisman said the MOH is jointly working with the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) to ensure the vaccines are not sold at exorbitant prices.

Commenting on whether the government will consider an influenza vaccine subsidy programme to prevent congestion at health facilities, he said the ministry will consider the best method and see whether allocations under Budget 2026 can ease the burden on people who need vaccination. – Bernama

Downpour hits veggie prices

Weather woes abroad and at home tighten supply

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PETALING JAYA: Malaysians may have to pay more for their greens if the monsoon season continues to bring persistent rainfall, says the Malaysian Federation of Vegetable Farmers Association.

Its president Lim Ser Kwee said recent flooding in several countries, including Thailand, Vietnam and Indonesia had begun to push up prices of vegetables.

"We import a large variety of vegetables from these three countries and the prices have increased recently due to the recent massive flooding there.

"Also affected is the supply from China due to recent cold snaps affecting harvest," he said when contacted yesterday.

On the local front, Lim said while Cameron Highlands and several parts of the country may have escaped the recent floods, cloudy skies had also affected crop yields.

"Luckily, Cameron Highlands and states such as Johor, Pahang and Melaka were not hit by heavy downpours and floods.

"But the lack of sunshine affected the growing and maturing cycles of vegetables such as sawi bunga (Chinese flowering cabbage) and tomatoes," he said.

He cited the prices of tomatoes, which have increased to over RM5 per kg as compared to RM2 and RM4 per kg previously.

It was also reported that prices of some local and imported vegetables had increased by between RM5 and RM8 per kg recently.

Lim said the situation would worsen if states such as Johor and Pahang are hit with persistent rainfall during the monsoon.

He added that the federation, which has over 6,000 members nationwide, has yet to determine the actual losses.

"We have had reports of losses but so far, our members in Penang were not too badly affected."

According to the Malaysian Meteorological Department (MetMalaysia), the northeast monsoon will continue until March next year, bringing five to seven episodes of heavy rain, which could cause floods in low-lying and riverine areas.

Last Thursday, MetMalaysia

issued a warning for continuous heavy rain and strong winds over a large swathe of Peninsular Malaysia due to the development of the rare tropical storm Senyar in the Strait of Malacca.

Cameron Highlands Vegetable Farmers Organisation president Datuk Chai Kok Lim said that vegetable farms in the highlands were not affected by recent floods.

"It did not disrupt farming operations here and fortunately, the weather has been sunny over the past few days.

"We hope that it remains this way but there is a fear that the monsoon will bring heavy rain again," he said, adding that there were about 2,000 farmers in Cameron Highlands.

Meanwhile, the Agriculture and Food Security Ministry has activated its disaster operation room to assist farmers, planters, livestock owners and fishermen affected by floods in several states.

It was activated on Nov 28, following MetMalaysia's forecasts for the current monsoon season.
