TANGANI ISU TICKET SCALPING

Tiket G-Dragon dijual lima kali ganda

Johor Bahru: Perbincangan bagi mencari penyelesaian berhubung isu *ticket scalping* atau ulat tiket sesebuah konsert akan diadakan termasuk kemungkinan membentangkan rang undang-undang (RUU) berkaitan.

Timbalan Menteri Komunikasi, Teo Nie Ching berkata, langkah itu perlu dibuat berikutkan aduan yang diterima mendakwa harga tiket konsert yang dijual semula mencecah sehingga lima kali ganda.

Menurutnya, isu berkenaan timbul setiap kali terdapat penganjuran konsert

artis antarabangsa terkenal di negara ini.

"Kementerian Komunikasi akan adakan satu perbincangan dengan Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) untuk bincang apa hala tuju (*ticket scalping*).

"Saya juga dimaklumkan bahawa KPDN sedang membuat kajian tentang isu ini, ada kemungkinan bahawa RUU akan dibentang tetapi bukan atas kapasiti kementerian saya dan saya tidak boleh buat pengumuman."

"Kami buat perbincangan isu ulat tiket bukan

sahaja dengan KPDN, tetapi juga dengan pengurus acara dan syarikat tiket supaya boleh cari penyelesaian paling sesuai diguna pakai di negara ini," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian selepas merasmikan Geran Digital PMKS Madani (GDPM) Festival 2025 peringkat Johor di Permas Jaya di sini, semalam.

Menurut Nie Ching, isu itu dilihat serius kerana Malaysia kerap menganjurkan konsert besar menampilkan artis antarabangsa dan mendapat perhatian peminat luar negara.

"Contoh konsert G-Dra-

gon baru-baru ini, memang ada aduan penjualan tiket kerana permintaan memang sangat-sangat tinggi. *Ticket scalping* membeli pada kuantiti yang banyak dan menjual semula pada harga jauh lebih tinggi.

"Aduan yang kami terima, contohnya Konsert G-Dragon ada peminat yang sanggup bayar lima kali ganda (harga tiket). Mereka sanggup kerana memang nak datang sini untuk tengok G-Dragon."

"Kita juga faham bahawa ini isu *ticket scalping* yang perlu diteliti oleh kementerian," katanya.

Bincang kaedah tangani isu *ticket scalping*

STUDYING SIMILAR LAWS

Govt mulls law to curb concert ticket scalpers

JOHOR BARU: The government is considering introducing a law to address the growing problem of concert ticket scalping, said Deputy Communications Minister Teo Nie Ching.

She said the proposal was among options being explored by the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry as a solution to the issue.

Teo said the Communications Ministry will hold discussions with the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry to address the problem.

She said complaints had poured in over tickets being resold at up to five times their original price, especially for international acts performing in Malaysia.

"This issue surfaces every time a big-name international artiste holds a concert here."

"The Communications Ministry is also engaging event organisers and e-ticketing companies to find the most suitable solution," she said after launching the Johor-level Madani MSME Digital Grant Festival 2025 in Permas Jaya here yesterday.

Citing the recent G-Dragon concert, Teo said some fans paid five times the face value due to overwhelming demand, with scalpers bulk-buying and reselling tickets at inflated prices.

She added that the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry

was studying the matter and that lessons could be drawn from countries which have implemented anti-scalping legislation.

On a separate matter, Teo said the Malaysian Communications and Multimedia Commission (MCMC) removed 2,033 advertisements for products and services not authorised by the Health Ministry and other agencies from the start of this year until Aug 1.

She said the move followed 2,283 complaints received during the period, with such removals having been carried out since 2022.

"In 2022, MCMC received eight complaints and removed all related ads. In 2023, 439 complaints were received and 390 ads were removed.

"In 2024, MCMC received 3,312 complaints and took down 1,643 unauthorised online ads."

Teo said her ministry works closely with the Health Ministry on such cases as the latter had the necessary expertise.

"When we receive a complaint from the Health Ministry, MCMC will notify the social media platform providers to take the advertisement down if it is unauthorised.

"However, if a complaint is received from the public we will refer it to the Health Ministry for verification before further action is taken," she said.

Menu Rahmah disappearing

Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry exploring ways to revive affordable meal initiative, which eateries find challenging to sustain without govt assistance.

Public laments Menu Rahmah now harder to find

► Popular RM5 meal programme struggles to survive without dedicated funding, govt exploring options

PETALING JAYA: Menu Rahmah, once a symbol of affordable dining for Malaysians facing rising cost of living, has become scarce.

Many Malaysians now report meals under Menu Rahmah have largely disappeared from eateries and food courts nationwide.

A school teacher based in Johor, Na'aim Idris, 37, expressed his frustration at this.

"I haven't seen Menu Rahmah since the late (Datuk Seri) Salahuddin Ayub passed away. It used to be my go-to lunch option at Mydin or stalls near Pasir Gudang. Now I spend RM10 to RM15 just for lunch. I truly miss Menu Rahmah."

He said despite being single, life

in Johor is becoming financially tougher.

"For RM50 with Menu Rahmah, it gets you more than five meals. If it were up to me, I'd want Menu Rahmah all the time."

Norzie Marwani Zakaria, a 36-year-old department manager at a retail outlet, said she has not seen Menu Rahmah in most eateries.

"For someone like me, juggling work and family, Menu Rahmah helped reduce my burden, especially at the end of the month," said the mother of two.

She said although the portion sizes are small, the meals are sufficient for those on a budget.

"At my workplace, there are still six outlets offering Menu Rahmah meals such as steamed *dim sum*,

chicken rice, spaghetti bolognese, sizzling noodles, *Hailam* noodles and chicken porridge.

"The meals are nice and satisfying. They are perfect for children too, as the small portions help avoid wastage."

It is believed that sustaining the menu is a challenge for major retail outlets and food operators due to rising costs of ingredients and operations.

Pulai MP Suhaizan Kayat said Menu Rahmah was always meant to be short-term - to address the high cost of living.

"The offer of RM5 meals was expected to taper off over time. With costs continuing to rise, it is becoming tough to sustain."

Suhaizan added that the government continues to offer other forms of assistance to help ease living costs, including the recently announced RM100 aid under Sara or Sumbangan Asas Rahmah.

Menu Rahmah was launched in January 2023 by the late Salahuddin, former Pulai MP and

then minister for domestic trade and cost of living. It was a nationwide initiative to offer meals at RM5 or less to help ease the financial strain on lower-income groups. Salahuddin passed away on July 23, 2023.

When contacted by *theSun*, Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Deputy Minister Datuk Fuziah Salleh said Menu Rahmah and Bakul Rahmah initiatives had no government budget allocation when they were first introduced.

"Only Jualan Rahmah received government funding. Menu Rahmah was a voluntary effort from traders."

"When it was introduced, the feedback was very positive, especially from students."

"As it was voluntary and not backed by a dedicated budget, sustaining it has been challenging."

"The ministry is now exploring ways to revive the initiative, with discussions planned with the Finance Ministry."

She however, did not specify a timeline for its revival.

'Regulate digital trade fairly'

Experts: Proposed e-commerce law must safeguard buyers and sellers alike

PETALING JAYA: The proposed e-commerce law must strike a balance between protecting consumers and safeguarding traders in the country's fast-growing digital marketplace, say economists.

Geoffrey Williams said while protection for e-commerce users is vital to ensure confidence in the digital market ecosystem, there should be mechanisms to safeguard both users and traders in terms of transactions, cybersecurity, personal data protection as well as product and service quality.

"However, there must be a full evaluation of the best approach to avoid killing e-commerce with over-regulation," he said when contacted yesterday.

On Saturday, the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry held an engagement session to review the

proposed e-commerce legislation with representatives from the digital platforms, traders' associations, consumer protection organisations, legal experts and academics, among others.

Based on the ministry's data, online transactions remained the highest category of complaints

between 2023 and 2024, involving the sale of counterfeit goods, misleading advertisements, use of false identities by sellers, and difficulties in dealing with overseas suppliers, particularly regarding product returns and refunds.

The ministry proposed drafting an e-commerce law anchored on three main pillars – clearer industry responsibilities, more effective enforcement, and comprehensive protection for consumers and small traders.

Williams warned that regulating overseas suppliers could be challenging unless the products were sold through local platforms.

"In the end, user awareness of risks and exposing fake sites and bad suppliers must also be increased to provide market regulation faster than regulatory agencies.

"The Malaysia Digital Economy

Corp is developing and promoting a standards system for e-commerce through the economy platform and this can be an important part of the mix in tackling the problem," he added.

Another economist, Assoc Prof Dr Aimi Zulhazmi Abdul Rashid, said the recently announced 13th Malaysia Plan (13MP) underlined Artificial Intelligence as a key focus in the five-year plan.

"In fact, the Malaysia Digital Economic Blueprint launched earlier embeds a delivery-driven governance framework and a whole-of-nation approach involving partnerships between the rakyat, businesses and the government," he said.

The growth of e-commerce transactions, he added, has been exponential since the pandemic, with new ways of doing business across the supply chain introduced and accepted as part of a

new lifestyle.

"Cross-border trade on micro-scales, including digital banking and digital insurance, introduces borderless boundaries, creating huge difficulties for the authorities in law enforcement," he added.

Aimi Zulhazmi said scammers, fraudulent products, services and investments were among the most common crimes reported, with numbers growing rapidly and putting tremendous pressure on the authorities.

"The proposed e-commerce law by the government is certainly a step in the right direction and must be supported if Malaysia aspires to achieve the 13MP targets.

"The legislation, once approved, can continue to be improved over the years," he said, adding that the drafting of the law must include all relevant parties."

未申報低價促銷 閩商戶遭罰款

纳闽10日讯 | 纳闽国内贸易及生活成本部（KPDN）执法部于昨日（9日）进行周边检查后，对一家休闲及体育用品商户处以罚款。

检查结果发现，涉事商户为了进行低价促销，对多款商品进行了降价展示。

然而，进一步检查发现，该商户未能向KPDN提交低价销售通知，因此违反了《2011年商品说明法》（第730法案）。

根据商家的违规行为，因此被处以罚款。

第730法案规定，个人可处以不超过10万令吉的罚款或不超过3年的监禁，或两者并罚。

第二次及之后的违法行为，可处以不超过25万令吉的罚款或不超过5年的监禁，或两者兼施。

如公司或团体可处以不超过25万令吉的罚款。第二次及之后的违法行为，罚款不超过50万令吉。

政府对廉价销售实施管控，以确保每次促销活动都透明进行，不会误导消费者，并符合规定的期限和条件。

各方的合作对于确保纳闽公平、透明和道德的商业生态系统能够持续加强至关重要。
