## KPDN, MoF perluas akses SARA di kawasan pedalaman

RANAU: Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) akan bekerjasama dengan Kementerian Kewangan (MoF) bagi memperluas akses pembelian barangan asas oleh penerima Sumbangan Asas Rahmah (SARA), termasuk di kawasan luar bandar menerusi Program Jualan Rahmah MADANI (PJRM) Bergerak.

Menterinya, Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali berkata, ketika ini seramai 506,000 penerima SARA di seluruh negara, termasuk di Sabah, boleh membeli barangan keperluan asas di 4,152 premis terpilih, merangkumi 470 premis di negeri itu.

Katanya, cadangan perluasan akses SARA ke lokasi PJRM Bergerak bertujuan memastikan penerima bantuan di

pedalaman turut berpeluang menikmati harga barangan lebih rendah serta kemuda-

han pembelian menggunakan MyKad.

"Inisiatif ini akan mem-

beri manfaat besar kepada rakyat luar bandar kerana ia membolehkan mereka meng-

gunakan bantuan SARA secara langsung di lokasi PJRM Bergerak yang menghampiri komuniti mereka," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian ketika merasmikan Program Jelajah Karnival KPDN 2025 dan Kempen Beli Barangan Malaysia Zon Sabah di Kompleks Sukan Ranau pada Sabtu. Program tiga hari yang berlangsung dari 25 hingga 27 Julai itu dijangka menarik lebih 60,000 pengunjung.

Menurut Armizan, bagi negeri Sabah sahaja, kerajaan telah menyalurkan RM410 juta kepada 830,000 penerima Sumbangan Tunai Rahmah (STR) manakala RM500 juta lagi kepada penerima SARA setakat Julai 2025.

Katanya, penganjuran karnival itu juga menjadi platform untuk memperkasa

Kempen Beli Barangan Malaysia 2025 menerusi tema 'Jom Beli Lokal', sebagai galakan kepada pengguna menyokong produk tempatan dan mengurangkan kebergantungan kepada barangan import.

Tambah beliau, KPDN turut menyambut baik pengumuman Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim mengenai tambahan peruntukan RM300 juta bagi memperluaskan pelaksanaan PJRM di seluruh negara, termasuk 2,276 siri di Sabah pada tahun ini.

"Sehingga 26 Julai, sebanyak 1,089 siri PJRM telah dilaksanakan di negeri ini. Kita akan terus tingkatkan kekerapan pelaksanaan PJRM agar manfaatnya dapat dinikmati lebih ramai rakyat di seluruh pelosok Sabah," katanya. -JT



Sara recipients can use MyKad to buy

## 470 Sabah supermarts, stores

**RANAU:** A total of 470 supermarket and grocery premises in Sabah are now part of the 4,152 nationwide outlets where Sara recipients can use their MyKad to purchase basic necessities.

Minister of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN), Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said that apart from purchases at existing fixed premises, KPDN proposed that Sara assistance could also be used for purchases at the Mobile PJRM in the future.

This initiative, he said, allows Sara recipients, especially in rural and inland areas, to make purchases using the SARA assistance provided in the MyKad at the mobile PJRM locations.

According to him, for the state of Sabah, until July 2025, a total of RM410 million has been disbursed to 830,000 STR recipients.

He added that RM500 million has also been disbursed to 506,000 Sara recipients.

Armizan, who is also the Member of Parliament for Papar, said this while officiating the KPDN Carnival Tour Program

2025 and the Buy Malaysian Goods Campaign for the Sabah Zone held at the Ranau Sports Complex on Saturday.

The KPDN continues to organize the KPDN Carnival Tour Program and the Buy Malaysian Goods Campaign Series 2 for the 2025 Sabah Zone in Ranau.

The 3-day program from 25 to 27 July 2025 is expected to attract 60 thousand visitors.

The main objective of the organization is to popularize government services at the grassroots, especially services under the responsibility and functionality of the KPDN.

The KPDN Carnival 2025 also serves as a catalyst in strengthening the Buy Malaysian Goods Campaign (KBBM) 2025 through the theme "Let's Buy Local" as continuous support for local products and strengthening the domestic economy.

Armizan added that this campaign is a strategic step to strengthen domestic economic growth while helping entrepreneurs and local micro, small and medium enterprises (PMKS) in expanding their

market network.

"At the same time, this initiative provides space to highlight the quality of local products which can be the main choice and thus reduce dependence on imported goods.

"Additional Allocation for the Rahmah Madani Umbrella Initiative KPDN welcomes the additional allocation for the Rahmah Madani Sales Program (PJRM) of RM300 million announced by Dato' Seri Anwar Ibrahim, Prime Minister on July 23, 2025.

"Through this additional allocation, KPDN will increase the frequency of PJRM implementation nationwide with a target of 20 thousand series of PJRM implementation throughout 2025," he said.

For the state of Sabah, Armizan said that KPDN is targeting 2,276 series of PJRM throughout this year.

Starting from 1 January to 26 July 2025, a total of 1,089 series of PJRMs have been implemented in Sabah.

Expansion of Rahmah Basic Contribution (Sara) for All KPDN also welcomes and appreciates the initiatives and efforts focused on the well-being of the people through the additional allocation of Rahmah Cash Contribution (STR) and Rahmah Basic Contribution (Sara) from RM13 billion to RM15 billion for this year.

This additional RM2 billion is for a one-off Sara assistance of RM100 to all Malaysians aged 18 and above.

At the same time, he said, KPDN will collaborate with the Ministry of Finance (MOF) to expand access for Sara recipients to purchase basic necessities.

Meanwhile, about 60,000 visitors flocked to the 2025 KPDN Carnival Sabah Zone KBBM held over three days starting on Friday (July 25-27) at the Ranau Sports

Complex (free admission).

KPDN Business Development Division Director Adiratno Che Ani said the target is also to chalk RM250,000 in sales value through the Buy Malaysian Goods Campaign (KBBM).

"A total of 60 entrepreneurs from Sabah and Peninsular Malaysia are present to market various products, including handicrafts, food and beauty products. All products are of good quality and comparable to foreign goods.

"Based on the response since this morning, I am confident the sales target of RM250,000 can be achieved when this programme ends on Sunday," he said at the Ranau Sports Complex.

He said the KBBM themed "Jom Beli Lokal" (Buy Malaysian Goods), is also a platform for local entrepreneurs and micro, small and medium enterprises (PMKS) to expand their marketing network to boost the domestic economy.

Various interesting activities at booths provided include Arm-Wrestling, KPDN Little Stars Bintang Lokal (two karaoke contests with prize-money) colouring contest, the Mobile Legends E-Sports Sara Hidar/Living Costs competition (RM3,000 in prizes), the Cost of Living Expedition based on a fact-finding concept and a concert billed as The Band Showdown which features music as a medium for the cost of living message.

The big attraction is a Lucky Draw offering grand prizes of a Perodua Alza 1.5L (H), Proton S70 1.5T Premium and a Modenas Karisma EX 125 motorcycle.

Also present at the event were Ranau Member of Parliament Datuk Jonathan Yasin, Assistant Minister to the Chief Minister and Paginatan Assemblyman Datuk Abidin Madingkir and others.

➤ Govt expands affordable goods programme with RM300m boost to Jualan Rahmah, aimed at reaching rural areas, ease access and aid local businesses

**RANAU:** The Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry will collaborate with the Finance Ministry to expand access to essential items for recipients of the Sumbangan Asas Rahmah (Sara) aid.

Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said the ministry had proposed that recipients be allowed to use their Sara aid at mobile Jualan Rahmah Madani programme locations, in addition to existing participating retailers.

Armizan said the additional RM300 million allocation for Jualan Rahmah would enable the ministry to increase its frequency nationwide, with a target of 20,000 series throughout this year, Bernama reported.

"For Sabah, the ministry is targeting 2,276 Jualan Rahmah series throughout this year. As of July 26, a total of 1,089 have already been implemented. We will adopt several approaches to ensure the target is achieved by year-end."

He said the approaches included increasing the range of items offered and enhancing cooperation with strategic retail partners.

## Penerima SARA boleh beli barangan asas di 4,152 premis

**RANAU:** Penerima Sumbangan Asas Rahmah (SARA) kini boleh membeli barangan keperluan asas di 4,152 premis peruncitan di seluruh negara, termasuk 470 premis di Sabah, menggunakan bantuan yang dimuatkan ke dalam MyKad.

Menteri Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup, Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali berkata, pihaknya turut mencadangkan agar bantuan ini boleh digunakan untuk pembelian di lokasi Program Jualan Rahmah MADANI (PJRM) Bergerak, khususnya bagi memudahkan penduduk luar bandar dan pedalaman.

Katanya, ini akan memperluas akses penerima SARA kepada barangan asas dengan lebih mudah, sekali gus memastikan keberkesanan bantuan yang disalurkan oleh kerajaan.

"Sehingga Julai 2025, sebanyak RM410 juta disalurkan kepada 830,000 penerima Sumbangan Tunai Rahmah (STR) di Sabah, manakala RM500 juta lagi telah disalurkan kepada 506,000 penerima SARA," katanya.

kasakan produk tempatan dan ekonomi domestik," katanya.

Beliau berkata, inisiatif ini juga memberi peluang kepada perusahaan mikro, kecil dan sederhana (PMKS) untuk mengembangkan pasaran dan menonjolkan kualiti produk tempatan sebagai pilihan utama pengguna, sekali gus mengurangkan ketergantungan terhadap barangan import.

Mengulas lanjut, beliau memaklumkan peruntukan tambahan RM300 juta bagi PJRM yang diumumkan Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim pada 23 Julai lalu akan membolehkan KPDN melaksanakan sebanyak 20,000 siri PJRM di seluruh negara sepanjang tahun ini.

"Bagi Sabah sahaja, sebanyak 2,276 siri PJRM disasarkan, dan sehingga 26 Julai, sebanyak 1,089 siri telah pun dilaksanakan," katanya.

Dalam pada itu, KPDN menyambut baik penambatan peruntukan STR dan SARA daripada RM13 bilion kepada RM15 bilion bagi tahun 2025.

## KPDN serah proses perundangan isu royalti

**K**EMENTERIAN Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) menyerahkan kepada proses undang-undang serta sistem kehakiman berkaitan isu royalti muzik.

Menterinya Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali berkata terdapat segelintir pihak yang tidak berpuas hati dan sedang melakukan semakan kehakiman di mahkamah ketika ini.

"KPDN, MyIPO dan Menteri KPDN sendiri telah dinamakan sebagai responden. Proses sedang berlangsung di mahkamah.

"Kita serah kepada proses undang-undang dan sistem kehakiman. Matlamat saya hanya mahu hak semua pihak dilindungi serta dipelihara termasuk para artis dan karyawan.

"Hal ini kerana ramai dalam kalangan anak seni di negara ini yang

akhirnya susah dan kerajaan tidak boleh dilihat tiada melakukan sesuatu untuk mewujudkan kerangka perundangan yang lebih jelas dan menyeluruh," katanya selepas menghadiri Karnival Jelajah KPDN Zon Sabah di Ranau pada Sabtu.

Terdahulu Armizan sempat bertemu dua artis tempatan Sabah Bella Astillah dan Elica Paujin bagi berbincang secara ringkas mengenai perkembangan kerjaya mahupun kefahaman mereka terhadap isu royalti muzik yang semakin mendapat perhatian umum.

Dalam pada itu Armizan menyatakan kementeriannya menerusi agensi Perbadanan Harta Intelektual Malaysia (MyIPO) bakal memperkenankan Garis Panduan (GP) Organisasi Pengurusan Kolektif (CMO) di bawah Seksyen 27M, Akta Hak Cipta 1987.

Beliau berkata MyIPO diberi kuasa untuk mengeluarkan GP berhubung

perisytiharan dan pengendalian kepada mana-mana pihak didaftarkan sebagai CMO yang diberi mandat oleh pemunya hak cipta untuk menguruskan hak royalti mereka.

"Hasrat kita adalah menambah baik ekosistem pengurusan royalti muzik. Ini termasuklah peringkat advokasi dan pematuan semua pemegang taruh serta ketelusan tadbir urus termasuk kutipan dan pembayaran.

"Saya menegaskan karya dan bakat adalah harta manakala karya dan bakat ialah sumber rezeki.

"Sudah menjadi tanggungjawab beliau yang memimpin KPDN hari ini untuk memastikan harta dan rezeki itu terus dinikmati oleh para karyawan muzik bukan sahaja sepanjang karier aktif masing-masing namun selama mana karya tersebut dimanfaatkan oleh semua pengguna," katanya.



## KPDN tambah baik ekosistem pengurusan royalti karyawan muzik: Armizan

**KOTA KINABALU:** Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) berhasrat menambah baik ekosistem pengurusan royalti di negara ini bagi memastikan rezeki daripada karya bakat terus dinikmati oleh karyawan muzik.

Menterinya Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali berkata antaranya melalui Agensi Perbadanan Harta Intelekt Malaysia (MyIPO) untuk memperkenalkan Garis Panduan (GP) Organisasi Pengurusan Kolektif (CMO) di bawah seksyen 27M Akta Hak Cipta 1987.

Beliau berkata langkah itu termasuk peringkat advokasi dan pematuhan semua pihak berkepentingan serta ketelusan tadbir urus kutipan dan pembayaran.

“Matlamat saya supaya hak semua pihak dilindungi dan dipelihara termasuk artis dan karyawan.

“Ramai yang akhirnya hidup dalam keadaan susah dan kerajaan tidak boleh dilihat tidak melakukan sesuatu dalam mewujudkan kerangka perundangan yang lebih jelas dan menyeluruh,” katanya menerusi perkongsian di laman Facebook semalam.

Armizan berkata MyIPO diberi kuasa untuk mengeluarkan GP berhubung perisytiharan dan pengendalian kepada mana-mana pihak yang didaftarkan sebagai CMO yang diberi mandat oleh pemunya hak cipta untuk menguruskan hak royalti.

“Namun, ada segelintir pihak yang tidak berpuas hati dan sedang melakukan semakan kehakiman di mahkamah, serta KPDN, MyIPO dan Menteri KPDN sendiri telah dinamakan sebagai sebagai responden.

“Menjadi tanggungjawab saya yang memimpin KPDN hari ini untuk memastikan harta dan rezeki itu terus dinikmati oleh karyawan muzik bukan sahaja sepanjang karier mereka, tetapi selama karya berkenaan dimanfaatkan oleh pengguna,” katanya.

Its Minister, Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali, said one of the ministry's efforts through the Intellectual Property Corporation of Malaysia (MyIPO) is to introduce Guidelines for Collective Management Organisations (CMOs) under Section 27M of the Copyright Act 1987.

He said this step includes advocacy and compliance initiatives for all stakeholders, along with improved governance transparency in royalty collection and disbursement.

"My goal is to ensure the rights of all parties, especially artistes and musicians, are protected and upheld.

"Too many end up struggling later in life, and the government must not be seen as neglecting its responsibility to establish a clear and comprehensive legal framework," he said in a Facebook post on Sunday.

He said MyIPO has the

authority to issue guidelines regarding declarations and operations to any party registered as a CMO, mandated by copyright holders to manage royalty rights.

"However, a small group remains dissatisfied and has filed for judicial review, naming KPDN, MyIPO, and the minister as respondents," he said.

Armizan stressed that, as the current minister, he bears the responsibility to ensure musicians and artistes continue earning income not only throughout their careers but also for as long as others use their work. — Bernama





## PPM Wilayah gempur dua lokasi penyeludupan, rampasan lebih RM767,000

"Anggaran nilai rampasan mencecah RM403,200. Kes disiasat di bawah Akta Kastam 1967 dan Akta Imigresen 1959/63,"katanya dalam kenyataan yang dikeluarkan, di sini.

Nazri berkata, operasi kedua pula dilaksanakan di

Kota Kinabatangan dan berjaya mematahkan cubaan penyeludupan minyak diesel bersubsidi berdasarkan maklumat awam.

"Dalam operasi itu, sebanyak 3,000 liter minyak diesel dirampas bersama dua kenderaan iaitu sebuah lori dan sebuah pacuan empat roda.

"Tiga lagi lelaki warga asing turut ditahan kerana gagal mengemukakan dokumen daripada pihak Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri (KPDN).

# Blanket subsidy for cooking oil in the spotlight

The Auditor General's Report 2025 Series 2 highlighted weaknesses in the implementation, monitoring and enforcement of the subsidised cooking oil scheme, which involved expenditure of RM10.88 billion between 2019 and February this year.

Among the findings of the National Audit Department (NAD) was that only 3.57 million tonnes of subsidised cooking oil, or 82.6% of the entire quota of 4.32 million tonnes, was supplied between 2019 and 2024.

The NAD found that the current policy did not specify any conditions for the purchase of subsidised cooking oil. There was also no specific distribution area for each packaging company.

The purchase limit of 3kg per customer per transaction did not tally with the ideal usage quota of 1.5kg per person per month, it noted.

The sale of subsidised cooking oil was not structured, with the item also sold to those not intended to benefit from the scheme, such as eateries, restaurants and hawkers, as well as sales involving 713,442kg that exceeded the purchase limit.

The NAD found differences between sales transaction information on inventory books, involving 13,124kg of cooking oil, as well as 45 points of sales and 10 transporters not having the required Controlled Scheduled Articles (CSA) licence. Meanwhile, two quota holders were found possessing two CSA licences for

the wholesale and retail of subsidised cooking oil at the same addresses.

The NAD found subsidised cooking oil sold above the controlled price of RM2.50 per kg, at between RM2.60 and RM4.00 per kg. This was due to the absence of specific prices at each level of the supply chain, as well as additional charges.

The sale of used cooking oil was also not conducted properly, with no clear standard procedures. The NAD highlighted that nine out of 72 packaging companies did not have halal certification, while six out of the nine had printed the halal logo on their packaging despite not having the certification.

Considering these weaknesses found in a programme aimed at alleviating the pressures of the rising cost of living for the people, the NAD recommended that the Ministry of

Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) take several actions for the programme to achieve its objectives. These include strengthening the implementation and enforcement of the programme's policies and procedures, strengthening the monitoring system and reporting, as well as reviewing the conditions for the CSA licence and premise monitoring.

The utilisation of e-COSS (cooking oil price stabilisation scheme) should also be enlarged in order to monitor sales and distribution records of subsidised cooking oil in real time, the NAD stated.

Ultimately, it recommended that the government adopt targeted subsidy measures for subsidised cooking oil, by enlarging the scope of existing subsidy channelling programmes such as Sumbangan Asas Rahmah (SARA). — By Kamarul Azhar **E**

## 內貿部將與財部合作 擴大SARA購日常品渠道

他说，除了现有的实体商店，其部门也建议未来允许在昌明关怀销售流动销售活动中使用SARA援助。

「这项举措将让偏远与乡区的SARA受惠者，可直接在流动销售地点使用嵌人身份证MyKad中的援助金进行购买。」

截至2025年7月，沙巴州已有83万名关怀现金援助（STR）受惠者获得了总额4亿1000万令吉的援助；同时，也有50万6000名SARA受惠者获得了5亿令吉的资助。

## 阿米占：提升生態系統與分配 積極改善音樂版稅措施

兰瑞27日讯 | 我国国内贸易及生活成本部长拿督阿米占重申，关于音乐版税的议题，数十年来一直备受关注，至今依然存在种种争议，其部门正在积极推动改善措施以加以应对。

其中一项努力是透过隶属于国内贸易及生活成本部的马来西亚知识产权机构（MyIPO），根据1987年版权法令第27M条文，推出「集体管理组织（CMO）指南」。

他表示，这项指南旨在规范任何被授权管理着作权人版税的组织的申报与运作方式。

拿督阿米占是于昨天在兰瑞举行的国内贸易及生活成本部巡回嘉年华活动中，与两位沙巴本地艺人贝拉阿斯迪拉和阿丽卡保津会面。

他也询问了她们的音乐事业发展的近况，以及对音乐版税制度的理解。

拿督阿米占表示，马来西亚知识产权机构获授权发布相关指南，以对被注册为集体管理组织的组织进行规范与监管，确保这些代表着作权人管理其版税的组织运作透明与合规。

「我们的目标是全面提升音乐版税管理的生态系统，涵盖推广倡议、利益相关者的合规性、治理透明度，以及版税的征收与分配。」

然而，仍有部分人士对此表示不满，并已针对有关事项向法院提出司法审查申请，国内贸易及生活成本部，马来西亚知识产权机构以及部长本人也被列为答辩人。

目前，司法程序仍在进行中。

「我们将尊重法律程序与司法系统的裁决。我的目标是确保所有相关方的权益受到保护，包括艺人与创作人。许多创作者在生活中面对经济困难，政府不能被视为对此无所作为，而必须建立更明确与全面的法律框架。」

## FPAM: Cost of living crisis shifts financial focus

The gap is not only academic — it translates into real-world vulnerability.

A 2024 survey found that 61% of Malaysians could not produce RM1,000 in an emergency, underscoring the need for more robust financial education and planning.

**M40 Group Under Strain**  
While all income groups are affected by economic changes, Tan said the middle 40% income group (M40) is currently the most financially strained.

Unlike the bottom 40% income group (B40), which receives direct subsidies and cash aid, or the top 20% income group (T20), which often has diversified income streams and better financial buffers, the M40 finds itself squeezed between rising costs and limited government support.

"The highest hit under this increase of SST is actually the M40, not so much the B40 because they still receive various forms of aids. The M40 — what I call the squeezed middle — is really bearing the brunt of these rising costs," he said.

With SST now applicable at 8% and certain services at 10%, and with subsidies being gradually rolled back, Tan said many in the M40 group have been forced to reassess their financial priorities.

"Previously, they probably could have saved more. Now, they actually have limited room to spend. So, for them, the key is to really prioritise their spending — focus on what is truly essential," he said.

### Shift Towards Short-term Survival

Tan observed a distinct behavioural shift this year, where individuals are moving away from long-term financial planning and putting a premium on liquidity and emergency reserves.

Many Malaysians are now saving less for retirement or investments, instead allocating more towards meeting daily and monthly living expenses.

"This year, we can see people are moving from long-term planning to short-term needs. Liquidity is becoming a bigger concern. People are thinking 'What if I lose my job? How do I survive the next few months?'" he said.

This has led to an increase in the use of credit, particularly credit cards, personal loans and newer models such as "buy now, pay later" (BNPL) services. While convenient, these solutions can also become traps if used without awareness or discipline.

"Many people find the small instalments of BNPL appealing, especially amid rising costs. But once it snowballs, it becomes difficult to manage," Tan added.

"We are seeing a lot more inclusive, holistic planning now. People are feeling insecure about their financial future, but after talking to us, they often feel more secure — more relieved, because they can see the gaps and work to fix them," he said.

FPAM planners are now expected to consider clients' full financial journeys, including their emotional and psychological attitudes towards money.

Beyond technical knowledge, Tan emphasised the growing need for financial planners to understand human behaviour.

Many financial decisions are shaped by past experiences, anxieties and cultural beliefs rather than logic or data alone.

"We now talk about the psychology of financial planning — what we also call financial behaviour. Sometimes decisions are not led by data, but by personal experience or emotional reactions,"

"Short-term needs are taking priority. Retirement planning is

being postponed and credit is increasingly being used as a financial buffer," Tan said.

To help Malaysians regain control of their financial future, FPAM is doubling down on public outreach. One of its flagship initiatives is the FinPlanU platform, created in partnership with the Securities Commission Malaysia under the InvestSmart initiative.

The platform connects the public with licensed financial planners through free one-on-one consultations, financial health checks and educational events.

It has proven particularly popular during expos and roadshows like InvestSmart Fest.

"It is a practical way for people to seek financial advice from licensed professionals. We run free financial health checks and public events where people can engage with us directly," Tan said.

FPAM also conducts community talks, student outreach, online webinars and contributes expert commentary in the media.

These efforts are part of its involvement with the Financial Education Network (FEN), a public-private platform aimed at improving financial literacy nationwide.

### Planning Demand on the Rise

Amid economic uncertainty, demand for financial planning services has surged. FPAM members are reporting increased client engagement, not only from affluent Malaysians but also from those in the M40 and B40 groups seeking guidance on debt, tax, insurance, retirement and healthcare.

Tan said the profession has evolved from product-pushing to more advisory-driven engagement.

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"We now talk about the psychology of financial planning — what we also call financial behaviour. Sometimes decisions are not led by data, but by personal experience or emotional reactions,"

he shared with TMR.

FPAM is addressing this by introducing new training modules on behavioural finance, as part of its continuous professional development for members.

These efforts aim to equip planners with the tools to handle clients' complex emotional and financial needs.

The association also aligns its practices with international standards, particularly the Financial Planning Standards Board's (FPSB) "knowing, doing, being" framework.

This ensures its members uphold the highest levels of ethics and client-focused planning.

### Practical Advice for Households

Tan provided several practical suggestions for Malaysians currently grappling with inflation, rising living costs and shrinking household budgets.

His first recommendation was to return to the basics of personal finance.

"Start with the basics. Write down your income and track all your spending, even if it is for a month. You will start to see where you can cut down or adjust," he said.

He encouraged households to prioritise essential spending categories such as food, transport, utilities and education, ensuring that necessary expenses are covered before allocating funds to discretionary purchases.

He also advised consumers to compare prices across different shops or platforms, and to buy in bulk where practical to take advantage of cost savings.

In addition, households should consider switching to more affordable brands when possible, as even small price differences can add up over time.

Tan stressed the importance of consistent saving, noting that even modest contributions to a savings account each month can help households build a basic emergency fund.

This, he said, can be critical in preventing the need to borrow during unforeseen events such as job loss or medical emergencies.

He also cautioned against the overuse of credit cards, personal loans and BNPL schemes, explaining that while these tools may offer short-term convenience, they often result in long-term financial strain if used without discipline.

Budgeting, Tan added, should not be a solitary task. He encouraged families to involve all household members — especially older children — in open conversations about budgeting and spending priorities.

This approach helps build

market volatility.

The fourth step is to prioritise financial protection through adequate insurance coverage and the maintenance of emergency funds.

These safety nets, Tan explained, help prevent families from having to dip into long-term savings when facing sudden crises such as illness or job loss.

Finally, he urged Malaysians to seek credible, professional advice and to avoid generic or "one-size-fits-all" financial tips that may not apply to their specific circumstances.

He said platforms such as FinPlanU, along with educational seminars and financial health checks, can equip even lower-income households with the knowledge and tools needed to make informed financial decisions.

For non-Bumiputera Malaysians without access to Amanah Saham Bumiputera (ASB), Tan recommended dividend-paying stocks and capital market instruments as viable alternatives.

While investment products like unit trusts and bank dividend stocks may seem out of reach for the average Malaysian, FPAM believed this is largely due to a lack of awareness rather than access.

Tan encouraged more Malaysians to explore options in the capital markets with proper guidance to avoid falling into risky schemes or scams.

### A Call to Action

Ultimately, FPAM believed that financial education should be integrated into early schooling and workplace training, accompanied by widespread awareness campaigns on budgeting, savings and investment.

"We need better guidance and education to confidently navigate these economic shifts. Financial literacy must continue to evolve to truly empower people," Tan said.

While Malaysia has made commendable progress in expanding access to financial planning, Tan said the nation's resilience will depend on how quickly this awareness translates into action.

"There is always a gap, especially now with all the uncertainty. It is getting tougher, but with the right support and advice, we can help people make better financial decisions — even in challenging times," he said.
