Sembilan barangan tersenarai

Bawang merah kecil India ditambah bawah SHMMP Deepavali 2025

Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) menyenaraikan sembilan barangan termasuk bawang merah kecil India di bawah Skim Harga Maksimum Musim Perayaan (SHMMP) Deepavali 2025.

Menterinya Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali berkata, pelaksanaan skim tersebut berkuat kuasa dari 16 hingga 22 Oktober ini.

"Tempoh pelaksanaan ialah selama tujuh hari iaitu empat hari sebelum perayaan, satu hari semasa perayaan dan dua hari selepas perayaan.

"Bagi tahun ini, sebanyak sembilan jenis barangan akan dikawal di bawah Skim ini, berbanding lapan jenis barangan pada SHMMP Deepavali 2024.

"Jenis barangan yang ditambah untuk tahun ini adalah bawang merah kecil India. Barangan yang terlibat ialah daging kambing biri-biri bertulang

import, tomato, cili merah, bawang merah kecil India, bawang merah kecil India (Ros), bawang merah besar import; kacang dal (Australia), kelapa biji (harga maksimum di peringkat borong sahaja) dan kelapa parut (harga maksimum di peringkat runcit sahaja)," katanya.

Beliau berkata demikian dalam sidang akhbar pelancaran SHMMP Deepavali 2025 di Sabah International Convention Center (SICC) di sini pada Isnin.

Armizan berkata, pelaksanaan SHMMP Deepavali 2025 kali ini adalah bersesuaian mengikut keadaan semasa iaitu mewujudkan suasana menang-menang kepada pengguna dan peniaga.

"Pengguna dapat menikmati harga yang berpatutan dan peniaga pula tidak tertekan dengan tempoh masa pelaksanaan yang terlalu lama.

"Selain faktor-faktor seperti permintaan serta penawaran, kos semasa, cuaca dan kadar upah, penentuan senarai barangan, paras harga maksimum dan tempoh pelaksanaan dibuat dengan mengambil kira pandangan daripada rakan strategik seperti Kementerian Pertanian dan Keterjaminan Makanan (KPKM), agensi-agensi kerajaan dan pemain-pemain industri," katanya.

Dalam pada itu, Armizan turut menegaskan bahawa KPDN sentiasa menjalinkan kerjasama dengan KPKM bagi memastikan

bekalan barangan yang dikawal adalah mencukupi sepanjang tempoh pelaksanaan skim.

"SHMMP Deepavali 2025 akan dikuatkuasakan melalui Akta Kawalan Harga dan Antipencatutan (AKHAP) 2011 dan membolehkan penentuan harga dibuat.

"Harga maksimum yang telah ditetapkan untuk SHMMP

Deepavali 2025 di peringkat pemborong dan peruncit boleh disemak melalui laman web KPDN di www.kpdn.gov.my.

"Pegawai-pegawai Penguat Kuasa KPDN di seluruh negara akan ditugaskan di lokasi-lokasi strategik seperti di pasar awam, pasar tani dan pusat membeli-belah barangan keperluan perayaan sepanjang tempoh Skim

bagi memastikan kepatuhan peniaga kepada perundangan berkaitan.

"Pada masa yang sama, penguatkuasaan secara berhemah dilaksanakan dengan memberi pendidikan, nasihat dan amaran supaya para peniaga mematuhi undang-undang yang berkuat kuasa dan mengamalkan perniagaan yang beretika," katanya.

他表示，该些食品包括新增印度小红葱，以及进口带骨绵羊肉、番茄、红辣椒、印度玫瑰小红葱、进口大红葱、澳洲扁豆、椰子果实及椰丝。

他说：「我们将在屠妖节的前 4 天、当

天及后 2 天实施价格管制，以免商家趁著佳节提高价格。」

阿米占也是联邦国内贸易及生活成本部长，他是在亚庇的沙巴国际会展中心会见本州印度裔商会后在记者会上这麽表示。

他指出，该措施符合当前市场情况，能够在消费者与商家之间创造双赢局面，「消费者可享有合理价格，而商家也对实施期限感到满意。」

他表示，这是依据 2011 年价格控制及反暴利法令执行，当局可针对生产商、批发商及零售商制定价格。

阿米占表示，该部门将派出执法人员到各个策略性地点查询，确保商家遵守相关法律。

他指出，这项策略有助于加强监督与执法效率，当局能够即时处理消费者投诉，并对违规商家采取行动。

他呼吁民众若发现商家违反该计划条例，应主动向部门举报。民众可通过 WhatsApp（019 -8488000）或电邮（eaduan@kpdn.gov.my）投诉，也可拨打热线 1800-88-6800，或使用 Ez ADU KPDN 手机应用程序提交投诉。（020）

Nine items listed under Deepavali price control scheme

KOTA KINABALU: The Festive Season Maximum Price Scheme (SHMMP) in conjunction with the Deepavali celebration, next week, will cover nine types of essential goods nationwide, from this Thursday (Oct 16).

Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Minister Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali said the scheme, which will run until Oct 22, is aimed at ensuring price stability during the festive period, and protecting consumers from unreasonable price hikes.

He said the items listed under the scheme include imported bone-in mutton, tomatoes, red chillies, small red onions and rose onions (from India), large imported shallots, Australian dhal beans, whole coconut (maximum price applicable at the wholesale level only), and grated coconut (maximum price applicable at the retail level only).

"This implementation takes into account feedback and input from industry players, to ensure they can fulfil their responsibilities without disrupting business operations.

"The introduction of this scheme reflects the government's strong commitment to ensuring that essential goods remain accessible at prices set during the Deepavali festive season. We also encourage traders to sell below the maximum price where possible, but not to exceed the ceiling set," he said.

He said this at a press conference after launching

the SHMMP for Deepavali 2025, at the Sabah International Convention Centre (SICC), here, yesterday.

The ministry is also working closely with the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Security (MAFS), to ensure a sufficient supply of goods throughout the festive period.

Armizan added that the controlled items would be labelled with pink price tags to help consumers easily identify goods under the SHMMP. The list of items and ceiling prices can also be checked via the Domestic Trade and Cost of Living Ministry's (KPDN) website, at www.kpdn.gov.my.

In another development, he said that Budget 2026, tabled by Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim last Friday, further strengthened the targeted subsidy reform agenda, to ensure that aid distribution is more effective and reaches the intended groups.

"The main objective is not to reduce subsidies for the people, but to ensure that subsidy distribution is more effective, reaches the targeted groups, and prevents leakages through embezzlement, misuse, and smuggling.

Armizan said that the implementation of assistance through MyKad for the Sumbangan Asas Rahmah (SARA) initiative is an innovation by the MADANI government, to enhance transparency and efficiency in subsidy distribution to the people. — Bernama

Budget 2026 strengthens targeted subsidy reforms, says Armizan

KOTA KINABALU: The Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) views the recently tabled Budget 2026 as a continuation and strengthening of the government's targeted subsidy reform agenda, said its minister, Datuk Armizan Mohd Ali.

He said the reforms under the Madani Government mark a significant shift from blanket subsidies — which often led to leakages and misuse — to a more focused, needs-based approach that ensures assistance reaches the rightful recipients.

"The main goal is not to reduce subsidies for the people, but to ensure they are distributed more effectively to the intended groups, while curbing leakages, misuse and smuggling," Armizan told a press conference here on

Monday.

He explained that one of the key mechanisms for implementing targeted subsidies is through cash assistance programmes such as the Sumbangan Tunai RAHMAH (STR) and Sumbangan Asas RAHMAH (SARA).

"To recap, the Federal Government first introduced cash assistance programmes in 2012 with a total allocation of RM2.6 billion. At that time, the highest amount received by eligible households was only RM500 per year under the pioneer initiative," he said.

"Under the Madani Government, this assistance programme has been significantly strengthened through two key methods — direct cash aid (STR) deposited straight into recipients' bank accounts, and cost-of-living

aid (SARA) for the purchase of daily essentials," he added.

Armizan said the total allocation for STR and SARA under Budget 2026 stands at RM13 billion, covering the B40 group, lower M40, senior citizens and single individuals — a substantial increase compared to 2012.

"For example, households earning below RM2,500 per month with five dependents can now receive up to RM4,600 per year through the combined STR and SARA programmes, compared to only RM500 in 2012," he said.

"This significant increase reflects the government's strong commitment to maintaining one of the most effective channels for assisting the people through direct cash support," he stressed.

Armizan also noted that SARA is a new initiative introduced under the Madani Government. Previously, assistance was only in cash form, but now beneficiaries can use their MyKad to purchase daily essentials.

"The RM13 billion allocation includes RM2 billion for the RM100 SARA assistance provided to all 22 million adult Malaysians, which will continue in 2026, meaning everyone will receive the RM100 SARA aid," he said.

"In my view, beyond being a recognition for all Malaysian adults, this initiative also demonstrates the success of the government's use of MyKad as a mechanism for more efficient subsidy delivery. We want every citizen to experience this innovative approach — one that was never imagined before

— where government aid can be distributed more effectively through the MyKad system," he said.

Armizan explained that starting January 2026, all STR recipients will also receive monthly SARA aid of up to RM100 per month (RM1,200 annually). For STR recipients registered under the e-Kasih programme, the SARA assistance will be increased to RM200 per month (RM2,400 annually), while single recipients will receive RM50 per month (RM600 annually).

Overall, he said, the 2026 Budget, tabled by the Prime Minister and Finance Minister last Friday, clearly reflects the government's commitment to reinforcing the targeted subsidy reform agenda.

"These are among the key

highlights of Budget 2026, which reaffirm the government's commitment to continuing subsidy and assistance programmes for the people," Armizan said.

He added that other forms of aid would also continue, including book vouchers under the Ministry of Education (MOE) and Ministry of Higher Education (MOHE), RM150 cash aid for school students, and cash assistance for welfare recipients.

"For us, cash-based aid remains the most effective and flexible method, as it empowers the people to decide their own priorities and essential needs for daily living," Armizan said.

"That, in essence, is the government's commitment as reflected in the 2026 Budget," he added.

KPDN vows to realise Budget 2026 agenda

KUALA LUMPUR: The Ministry of Domestic Trade and Cost of Living (KPDN) will continue to play a vital role in realising the Budget 2026 agenda, particularly in the implementation of targeted subsidies aimed at saving RM5 billion for diesel and RM2.5 billion for RON95.

Deputy Minister Datuk Dr Fuziah Salleh said these measures are designed to reduce leakages, enhance market efficiency and improve long-term competitiveness.

On the just-tabled national budget, she expressed full support for its implementation.

"It's a comprehensive plan that prioritises people's well-being, economic sustainability, and national competitiveness.

"It also reflects the Madani Government's firm commitment to driving inclusive economic growth, strengthening domestic supply chains, and safeguarding the B40 and M40 (respective lower- and middle-income)

groups from rising living costs," said the deputy minister in a statement.

Fuziah also welcomed the government's proposal to amend the Consumer Protection Act 1999 by introducing the 'Lemon Law' element to strengthen consumer rights and increase accountability among manufacturers and distributors regarding the quality of products sold.

She further commended the government's continued commitment to empowering the 'Buy Malaysian Goods' Campaign, supported by a RM20 million allocation for the promotion and labelling of 'Made in Malaysia' products.

"This initiative will reinforce national product identity in the global market while contributing to domestic economic growth and local employment opportunities."

She extended her gratitude to Prime Minister Datuk Seri Anwar

Ibrahim for his unwavering commitment to the welfare of low-income Malaysians, citing the RM1 billion allocation to address living costs, including RM600 million for the 'Payung Rahmah' Programme.

"The increase in allocation reflects the Madani Government's ongoing commitment of ensuring that no group is left behind in efforts to balance the cost of living," she said.

Expressing confidence in the country's fiscal direction, Fuziah said Budget 2026 should serve as a catalyst for more equitable and sustainable economic growth, while strengthening Malaysia's position as a resilient, people-oriented trading nation.

"The KPDN will continue to collaborate with all government agencies, industry players and consumer organisations to ensure that every budget initiative is effectively implemented and delivers direct benefits to the people," she added.

pada harga RM5 harga borong dan RM6 harga runcit.

"Harga maksimum bagi daging kambing biri-biri bertulang import RM28 (borong) dan RM30 (runcit);

tomato RM5 harga borong di Pantai Barat dan RM5.50 di Pantai Timur, RM6 harga runcit (Pantai Barat) dan RM6.50 harga runcit (Pantai Timur); cili merah RM14

harga borong (Pantai Barat) dan RM14.50 (Pantai Timur) dan RM16 harga borong (Pantai Barat) dan RM16.50 (Pantai Timur).

"Harga bawang merah kecil

India (Ros) adalah RM5.50 harga borong dan RM6.50 harga runcit; bawang merah besar import berharga RM3.50 harga borong dan RM4.50 harga runcit; kacang dal (Australia) berharga RM5 untuk harga borong dan RM6 harga runcit.

"Harga maksimum bagi kelapa biji adalah RM1.90 hanya di peringkat borong sahaja dan harga maksimum kelapa parut RM8.60 untuk harga runcit sahaja," katanya pada sidang media di sini semalam.

Dalam pada itu beliau berkata, pelaksanaan SHMMP Deepavali 2025 kali ini adalah bersesuaian mengikut keadaan semasa, iaitu mewujudkan suasana menang-menang kepada pengguna dan peniaga.

Menurutnya, pengguna dapat menikmati harga yang berpatutan dan peniaga pula tidak tertekan dengan tempoh masa pelaksanaan yang terlalu lama.

Fuziah sokong penuh Belanjawan MADANI 2026

KUALA LUMPUR: Timbalan Menteri Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup, Senator Datuk Dr. Fuziah Salleh, menyatakan sokongan penuh terhadap pembentangan Belanjawan MADANI Keempat Tahun 2026 oleh Perdana Menteri merangkap Menteri Kewangan, Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim pada Jumaat lalu.

Beliau menyifatkan belanjawan tersebut sebagai satu pelan komprehensif yang memberi keutamaan kepada kesejahteraan rakyat, kestabilan ekonomi dan daya saing negara.

Menurutnya, belanjawan ini mencerminkan komitmen teguh Kerajaan MADANI dalam memacu pertumbuhan ekonomi inklusif, memperkukuh rantai bekalan

domestik, serta melindungi golongan berpendapatan rendah dan sederhana (B40 dan M40) daripada tekanan kos sara hidup.

"Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Kos Sara Hidup (KPDN) akan terus memainkan peranan penting dalam menjayakan agenda Belanjawan 2026, khususnya dalam pelaksanaan subsidi bersasar yang disasarkan untuk menjimatkan RM5 bilion bagi diesel dan RM2.5 bilion bagi RON95," kata Fuziah dalam satu kenyataan.

"Langkah-langkah ini bertujuan mengurangkan ketirisan, meningkatkan kecekapan pasaran, serta memperkukuh daya saing jangka panjang," tambahnya.

Fuziah turut mengalu-alukan cadangan Kerajaan untuk

meminda Akta Perlindungan Pengguna 1999 dengan memasukkan elemen Lemon Law bagi memperkukuh hak pengguna serta meningkatkan akauntabiliti pengeluar dan pengedar terhadap kualiti produk yang dijual.

Beliau juga memuji komitmen berterusan Kerajaan dalam memperkasakan Kempen Beli Barangan Buatan Malaysia, yang disokong dengan peruntukan sebanyak RM20 juta bagi tujuan promosi dan penandaan logo 'Buatan Malaysia'.

Inisiatif ini, katanya, akan memperkukuh identiti nasional produk tempatan di pasaran global, di samping menyumbang kepada pertumbuhan ekonomi domestik dan peluang pekerjaan tempatan.

（亚庇13日讯）国内贸易及生活费部宣布将在本月16日至22日推行“屠妖节节庆最高价机制”，共有9种民众常用的节庆食材被列为统制商品，商家必须依照政府所设顶价销售。

部长拿督阿米占在亚庇召开新闻发布会时指出，今年共有9种食品被列为统制品，比去年的8种多出一种，即新增“印度小红葱”。其他受控物品包括带骨进口羊肉、红辣椒、番茄、澳洲扁豆、进口大红葱、玫瑰葱，以及椰子

（批发价）与椰丝（零售价）。

屠妖节统制品的执行期涵盖节日前4天、节日当天以及节后2天，目的在于稳定节庆期间的物价，避免商家趁机哄抬价格，减轻民众负担。

“我们在拟定顶价时已综合考量成本、汇率、气候以及全球供应变化，同时征询农业及粮食安全部和业者意见，以确保方案公平可执行。”

售价高于顶价 可罚款监禁

凡售卖有关统制品的商家必须使用粉红色

标签清楚标示价格，让消费者一眼辨识。

他说，若商家被查获以高于顶价出售，或未按规定使用标签，将违反《2011年反暴利及物价控制法令》，个人最高可被罚款10万令吉或监禁，公司则可被罚款高达50万令吉，或接获25万令吉的罚单。

阿米占呼吁消费者积极监督市场价格，可浏览内贸部官网<https://www.kpdn.gov.my>查询统制品价格。

一旦发现商家违规，可通过内贸部官网、WhatsApp或手机应用程序进行投诉，以便执法单位立即介入调查。

诺里克兰表示，申请已于9月15日开放，可通过官方网站mysubsidy.kpdn.gov.my进行。

他提醒申请人须确保车辆路税在每月28日之前仍有效，否则无法获批。

截至10月12日，共有1万2323家公司注册，其中2万4037辆车已被确认符合资格。

Kaji Lemon Law bukti kerajaan serius lindungi pengguna

FOMCA sokong syor agar pembeli dapat ganti rugi apabila produk, kenderaan rosak berulang kali

Kuala Lumpur: Hasrat kerajaan untuk memperkenalkan 'Lemon Law' melalui pindaan Akta Perlindungan Pengguna 1999 mencerminkan komitmen serius untuk memperkukuh hak pengguna serta meningkatkan keberkesanan mekanisme perlindungan pengguna sedia ada.

Ketua Pegawai Operasi Gabungan Persatuan Pengguna Malaysia (FOMCA), Nur Asyikin Aminuddin, berkata persatuan itu menyokong penuh cadangan kerajaan memandangkan mereka telah lama memperjuangkan undang-undang berkenaan.

"Tidak dapat dinafikan pengguna Malaysia kini semakin sedar hak mereka apabila membeli barangan atau kenderaan yang mengalami kerosakan berulang kali.

"Walaupun kesedaran itu semakin meningkat, hak mereka masih sering diketepikan dan tidak dilindungi sepenuhnya. Kami berharap pelaksanaan Lemon Law dapat melindungi hak pengguna, khususnya mereka yang membeli kenderaan baharu," katanya kepada BERNAMA.

Nur Asyikin berkata, banyak kes dibawa ke Tribunal Tuntutan

Pengguna, namun keputusan masih cenderung memihak kepada pengeluar atas alasan produk boleh terus dibaiki walaupun mengalami kerosakan yang sama tiga kali atau lebih.

"Pengguna memerlukan mekanisme undang-undang seperti Lemon Law melindungi kepentingan mereka serta memastikan pengeluar bertanggungjawab terhadap produk yang gagal memenuhi standard kualiti yang dijanjikan," katanya.

Dalam pembentangan Belanjawan 2026, Perdana Menteri, Datuk Seri Anwar Ibrahim yang juga Menteri Kewangan mengumumkan cadangan kerajaan untuk meminda Akta Perlindungan Pengguna 1999 bagi memasukkan elemen Lemon Law supaya perlindungan kepada pengguna lebih menyeluruh.

Hak kepada pengguna

Lemon Law ialah undang-undang yang memberi hak kepada pengguna untuk mendapatkan ganti rugi atau penggantian terhadap kenderaan atau barangan yang berulang kali rosak dan gagal memenuhi standard kualiti serta prestasi yang dijanjikan.

Penganalisis automotif, Hazeri Samsuri pula menyifatkan langkah kerajaan itu sebagai tepat pada masanya dan mencerminkan kesungguhan memperkukuh perlindungan pengguna.

"Memang sudah tiba masa kita laksanakan Lemon Law. Saya amat bersyukur kerana kerajaan

kali ini benar-benar serius untuk melaksanakannya, sebab isu ini saya dah perjuangkan 10 tahun, tetapi kerajaan sebelum ini tidak memahami kepentingannya. Baru apabila Menteri Pengangkutan, Anthony Loke memahami isu ini, ia mendapat perhatian sewajarnya," katanya.

Hazeri berkata, pelaksanaan undang-undang itu bukan sahaja akan memberi manfaat kepada pengguna, malah membantu pengeluar dan syarikat automotif menangani isu kualiti kenderaan yang semakin kompleks.

"Undang-undang ini amat diperlukan kerana kenderaan masa kini semakin canggih dan kompleks, sekali gus menjadikan kecacatan atau defect tertentu sukar dikesan pada peringkat awal. Dalam keadaan sebegini, proses tuntutan waranti boleh menjadi rumit.

"Contohnya, jika syarikat ingin menggantikan semula kenderaan bermasalah, prosesnya sukar kerana kebanyakan kenderaan dibeli melalui pinjaman bank dan tertakluk kepada Akta Sewa Beli. Maka, dengan adanya Lemon Law, ia dapat memudahkan kedua-dua pihak," katanya.

Sementara itu, Pengarah Digital PanduLaju, Gan Yong Li, berkata pelaksanaan Lemon Law akan menjadi *game changer* kepada industri automotif dan mengembalikan keyakinan pengguna terhadap sesuatu jenama.
